

# Local Cancer Society To Campaign Tonight

Every doorbell in College Station will ring tonight as local workers for the American Cancer Society observe "C-Day," Conquer Cancer Day.

Money collected from the drive will go to the American Cancer Society, a national voluntary health agency, to fight cancer on

three fronts—through research to find new cures for the disease, professional and public education and service to patients, Tom Mahoney, local chairman for the society, said.

The door-to-door campaign will high-light the annual Brazos County Campaign Against Cancer with a goal of \$5,000.

Cancer, classified as the No. 2 killer among diseases, kills more than a quarter million people each year, according to the American Cancer Society. More than 1,000 scientists in 127 hospitals, universities and laboratories throughout the nation are working under grants from this society seeking a final cure for cancer, Mahoney said.

"Funds collected in the local drive will go to further this cause," he added, "and attempt to stamp out this needless killing."

## Architecture Wives Win Wives Revue

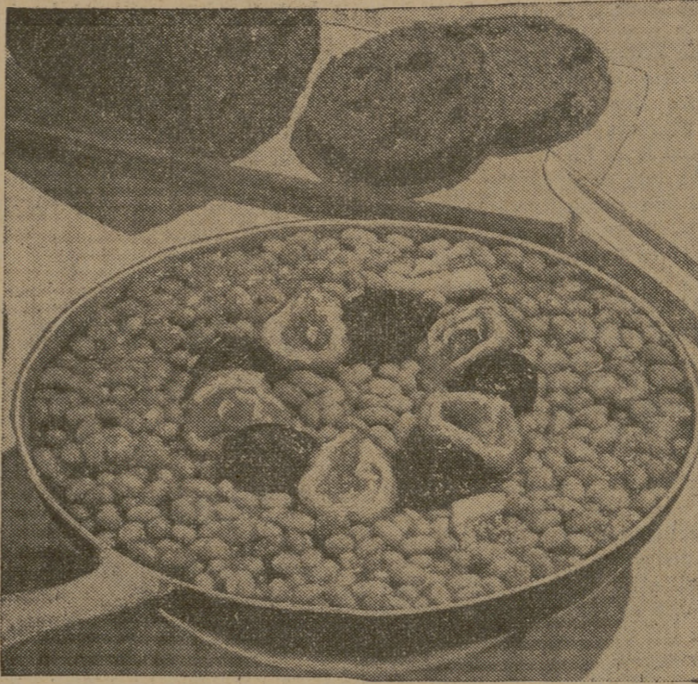

## Saturday Specials

### Quick, Easy Bean Dishes Ideal For Busy Weekend



It's the time of the year when Saturday becomes an extra busy day at home . . . especially for working folks.

There's gardening . . . painting . . . spring house-cleaning and a "dozen and one" chores to be done. Yet with all this, there's lunch and supper to prepare. Rely on the pantry shelf for a quick and easy meal. Make it one that requires little effort on your part.

Canned pork and beans with tomato sauce combined with dried apricots and prunes or with orange sections makes a "something special". Both recipes are easy to prepare . . . one done in a skillet on top of the range, the other in a casserole in the oven.

Serve with canned steamed brown bread and a crispy cabbage salad with sour cream dressing. For dessert . . . cup cakes (made from a mix) with chocolate sauce. And to go along . . . lots of hot coffee.

#### Fruited Pork and Beans

- 1 cup chopped dried apricots and prunes
  - ½ cup water
  - 2 cans (1 pound each) pork and beans with tomato sauce
- Cook dried fruit in water in covered saucepan until water is absorbed. Stir in beans; heat. Makes 4 generous servings.

#### Pork and Beans With Orange Topping

- 2 cans (1 pound each) pork and beans with tomato sauce
  - 1 orange peeled and cut into sections.
  - whole cloves (2 per orange section)
  - 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- Pour beans into a shallow pan or casserole. Stick cloves into orange sections; arrange on top of beans; sprinkle with brown sugar. Bake in a hot oven (400 degrees) about 20 minutes. Makes 4 servings.
