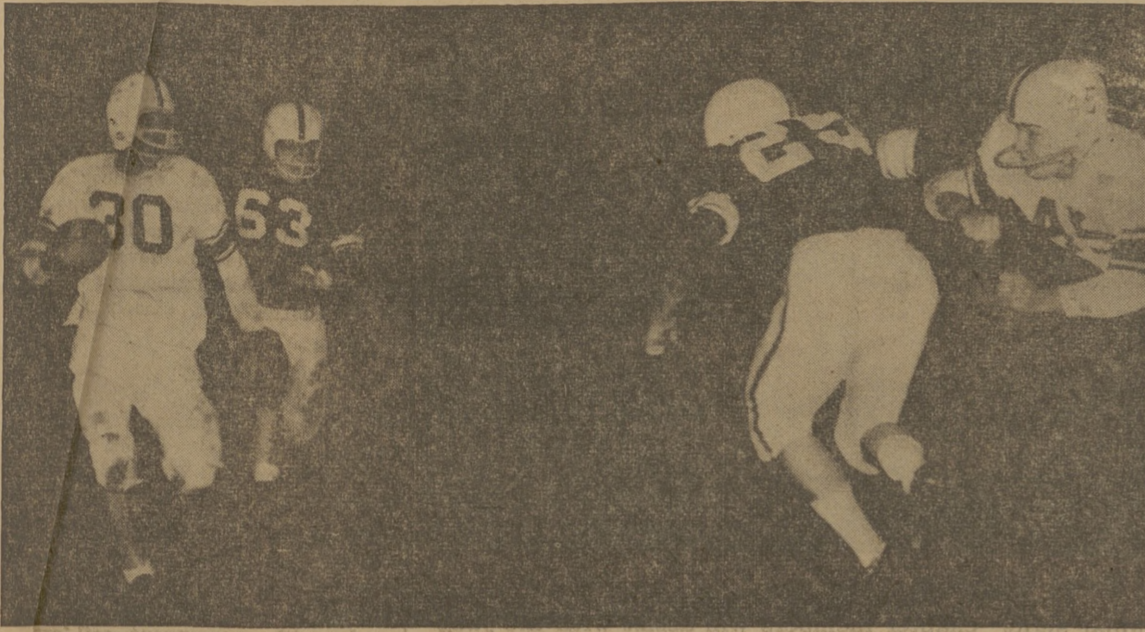


Alumni Stomp Myer's Varsity, 28-14

Varsity Outrushes Exes on Ground; LeBeouf Leading Ground Gainer

Bear Bryant's shadow still loomed over Kyle Field last night when the hard nose regime crushed the single wing for the second time this spring, 28-14.

It was the throwing arm of Quarterback Jimmy Wright that provided the difference between the alumni and the varsity, as he hit his receivers 10 of 21 times for 132 yards via air and two touchdowns.

Bull-like Gordon LeBeouf, fullback for the varsity squad, stole individual rushing honors with 110 yards the hard way and the first varsity touchdown. The alumni's George Gillar was a close second with 109 yards to his credit.

The exes opened the scoring parade with a 55-yard march down the field in 11 plays, climaxed by Wright's eight-yard pass into the end zone to John Crow and the touchdown. Gillar attempted the run for extra points, but was stopped two yards short of the goal.

line. Wright passed for 40 of the 55 yards.

Jim Myers' single wing then took charge of the ball and grinded out 81 yards—most of them on the ground—in 13 plays to tally and tie the score at 6-6. LeBeouf bulldozed over for the score with 55 seconds remaining in the first half. Milstead loped around left end for the extra points, putting the Maroon team in front of the exes, 8-6.

Wright loosened up his passing arm in the fading seconds of the half and literally threw his team downfield to the varsity 10-yard line, only to have Ed Dudley intercept his pass aimed at Bobby Conrad in the end zone, ending the half.

The Reds came charging out of the dressing room after the half to romp 80 yards up the field in seven plays for a touchdown. Dudley, quarterbacking the Reds, scored the TD when he took the ball on the 46 yard line, cut down the middle and outraced his pursuers to the goal line and six points. Dudley's try for the extra points was no good.

Gillar stepped into the spotlight

for the alumni in the third period, sparking his team for 67 yards in 8 plays and a touchdown. The jarring fullback took the handoff from Wright on the 20-yard marker and drove straight up the middle for the TD. Lloyd Taylor tried to run the ball over for the extra points and was stopped short of the goal. The game ended spring training for the Aggies, their first under the single wing mentor Jim Myers.

Ags Lag Behind Texas, Rice; UT Track Star Sets Record

AUSTIN — Aggie thinyclads once again followed on the coat-tail of two opponents in a triangular meet with the University of Texas and Rice yesterday.

The Aggies finished third with 27½ points behind Texas, 107½ and Rice's 34.

Texas' Eddie Southern lead his

teammates in scoring and broke the national collegiate 440-yard dash record, clocking a 46.1 around two turns.

The fabulous University of Texas star bettered the standing national mark of 46.2 set by Hebert McKenley of Illinois in 1947 and tied by Southern March 15 at Fort Worth.

Southern's open quarter mile race last night was his first since he tied the national mark in Fort Worth.

Southern was clocked unofficially in the first 220 yards in 21 seconds flat. He eased up until he

breezed in with his famous kick.

Southern also anchored his Texas sprint relay team to the winning time of '41 seconds flat, passing Rice's Charles Rouse on the anchor leg for the victory. He did not run on Texas' mile relay team which he led to the national mark at the Texas Relays.

The Texas' little miler, Joe Villarreal, won his specialty in 4:08.7, the fastest winning time ever turned in by the junior from Houston. He ran his last lap in 61 seconds.
