Aggies will be in charge of the morning service Sunday, with the sermon to be on the topic "The Love Letter." An all-church fellowship dinner will follow the service.

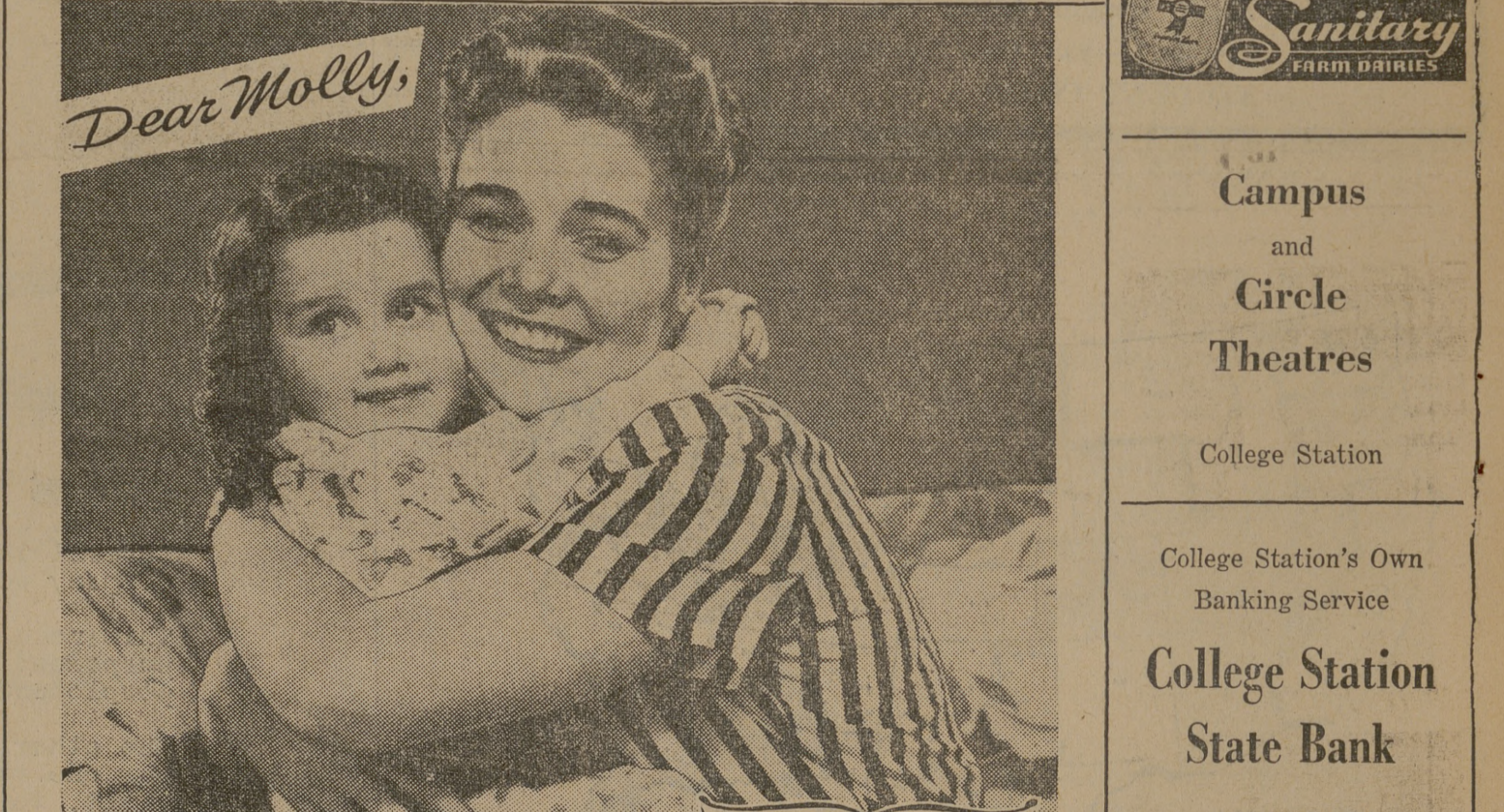
