- (melted) 1 package lemon chiffon pie
- filling mix

Stir together graham cracker crumbs and 2 tablespoons sugar. Add melted butter and mix well. Press onto bottom and sides of a baking pan. Place pie filling mix in a large deep mixing bowl. Add boiling water and mix thoroughly.

Add cold water, lemon rind and juice and beat vigorously until mixture is very foamy-about 1 minute. Add 1/3 cup sugar and beat until filling stands in peaks-this will take 1 to 3 minutes. Turn into pan with graham-cracker crumb mixture in it. Chill until set-1 to 2 hours.
