Job Prospects Look 'Brighter' Than in Spring

Employment prospects are brighter than they were in the spring, W. R. Horsley, director of the Placement Service, prophesied yesterday.

In a letter sent to all deans and department heads Horsley explained that the situation isn't all roses however. Only half the number of interviews for jobs held last year are scheduled for the '58-'59 school year. He said that many companies have cancelled their fall schedules and others have indicated that they will seek employees only once this year.

"Students will have to be more diligent in their pursuit of the job this year and will need more and better counseling from faculty and friends," the Placement Service head said.

To aid graduating seniors finding the job they seek, Horsley and his staff have planned group meetings to discuss current employment situations and the Placement Service operations. Three identical meetings will be held—Sept. 23, 24, and 25—to allow seniors interesting in job hunting guidance to attend.

Registration material for seniors will be distributed to department heads soon, Horsley promised. Included in the material will be copies of "Senior Sells Himself" and "College Placement Annual 1959" which offers hints on finding and landing a position.

First interviews are scheduled for early October, and students were urged by the service to register with the Placement Office as soon as possible so they can build up a reference file for employer use.

As in the past, daily interview schedules will run in The Battalion under the heading "Job Calls."
