## Copeland Talks To Wesleyans

The Rev. Kenneth W. Copeland, pastor of the Travis Park Methodist Church in San Antonio, will be the A&M Wesley Foundation's first speaker of the year tonight at 7:15 p. m. Clayton Cates, program chairman, said yesterday.

Rev. Copeland, who is to speak on "The Calling of the Church," was born in Bexar, Ark., the son of a Methodist minister, the Rev. J. W. Copeland. He began preaching at the early age of fourteen and had the distinction of preaching the baccalaureate sermon for his own high school graduating class at Corsicana, Texas.

He was educated at Westminster College, Tehuacana, Tex.; East Texas State College, Commerce, Tex.; Southern Methodist University, Dallas; and Garrett Biblical Institute, Evanston, Ill. He holds the honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree from Southwestern University, Georgetown, Tex.

Prior to coming to the Travis Park Church, one of the 10 largest Methodist Churches in America, he was pastor for four and a half years at the First Methodist Church in Stillwater, Okla.

Rev. and Mrs. Copeland have two daughters, Mrs. Pat Billard of Dallas, and Sue, a student at Southern Methodist University.

## Prof Replaced By Colleague In Iraq Job

Dr. Jack A. Dabbs has returned to A&M after teaching for a year and a half at the American Language Institute in Baghdad, Iraq.

When fall classes begin Dabbs, who has been on the college staff since 1950, will resume his duties as associate professor of modern languages.

The Language Institute is sponsored by the U. S. Information Agency to give students of Iraq a better knowledge of English before coming to this country to further their education. During the last school year more than 1,000 students of Iraq were enrolled in U. S. colleges and universities.

Succeeding Dr. Dabbs at the Language Institute will be Dr. T. E. Comfort, also an A&M associate professor of modern languages. Comfort is teaching at the Tunis Language Institute while awaiting transportation to Baghdad.

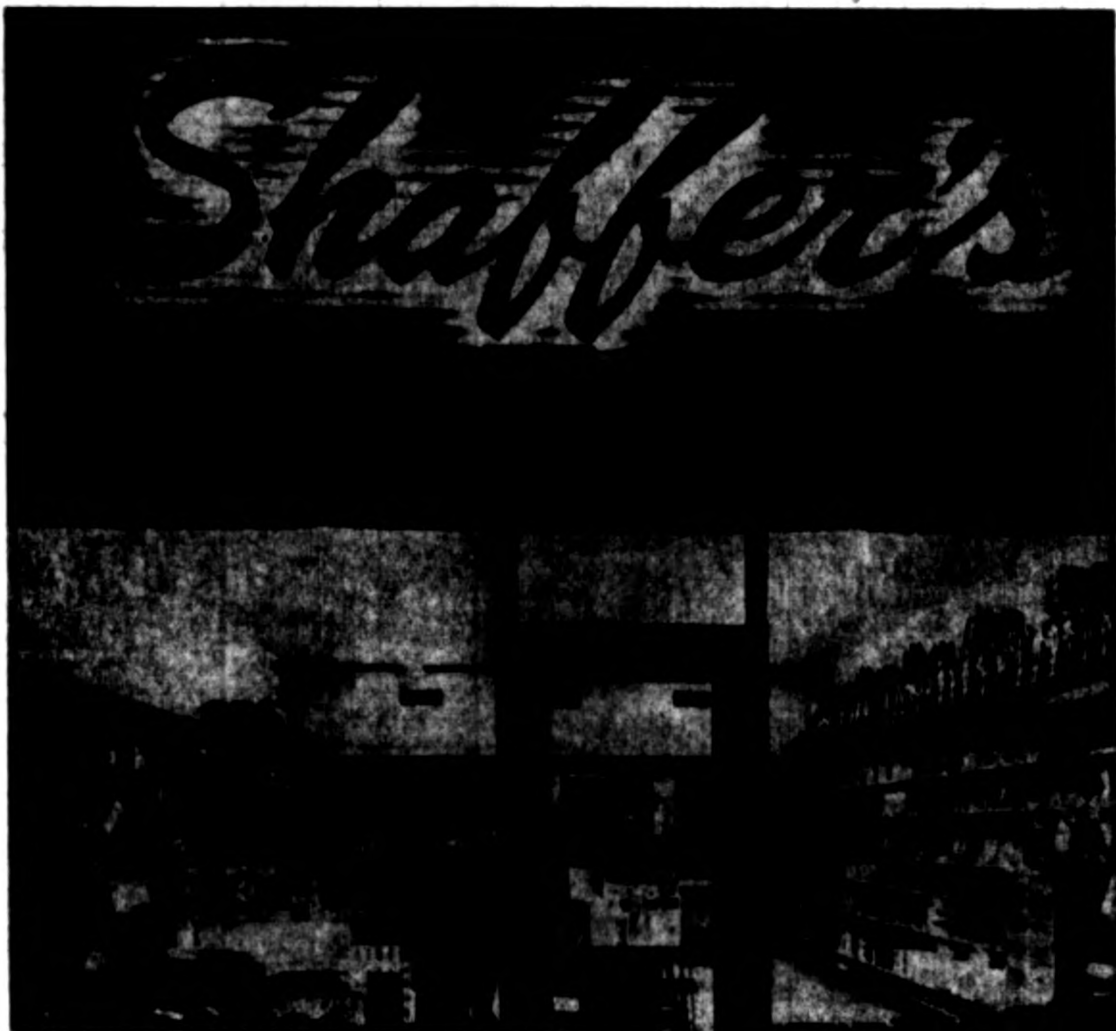
