## A&M Sports in Brief

Athletic Director Jim Myers and his staff are in the process of moving into their new offices in G. Rollie White Coliseum. The staff's offices are presently located under the stadium at Kyle Field.  
 The move will consolidate all the coaches of major sports in one building. In addition to the advantage of consolidation, the staff will benefit from other improvements over their old offices, such as space, central heating and air conditioning, a reception lounge and a greatly improved telephone and inter-communication system. A film and lecture room has also been included in the facilities.  
 Upon completion of the move the offices at Kyle Field will be

occupied by S. M. Meeks, athletic equipment manager, to be used for office and storage space.  
 The Aggie Soccer Team, defending state champions, will begin the 1958 season Oct. 12. The squad has lost a few key players via the graduation route, but are expected to field a strong team anchored by returning players Ernesto Alvarez, Jose Buentello, Alfonso Aldape, Orlando Cossani and Roger De Wames.  
**Cadets Selecting Corp Rifle Squad**  
 The 10 best riflemen in the Cadet Corps will be selected this week to represent A&M in the Fourth Army sectional and divisional rifle matches.  
 The matches will be held at Ft. Hood to determine the best college rifle team under the jurisdiction of the Fourth Army.  
 According to Capt. Hartnell, assistant professor of Military Science and Tactics, 30 cadets will be firing the .22 caliber rifle for record this week. The 10 cadets having the highest scores will make up the Cadet Army Rifle Team. The team will fire the standard caliber 30 M-1 rifle. All jackets, gloves, ammunition and sights will be furnished at government expense.
