

### Light Bulb Sale Extended to Friday

Light bulb sales by members of the College Station Lions Club to promote a "brighter" College Station will continue through today and Friday from 5 to 7:30 p.m.

The annual Lions door-to-door campaign offers bulbs in packets of nine, at \$2 per packet. Each packet contains one 150-watt, four 100-watt bulbs and four 75-watt bulbs, which retail at \$2.03.

Maj. R. P. Scoggins, chairman of the sales drive, also said citizens may call R. D. Fitch at VI 6-6071, C. G. Hass at VI 6-5904, or his residence at VI 6-6421, and have bulbs delivered to their door.

To pep up frozen green peas, try them this way. Put the frozen peas, with about 2 tablespoons of butter and a few wilted lettuce leaves in a heavy saucepan with a tightly fitting cover. ## S P B Bylaws Approved

### Other Employees of Student Publications

Clerical and non-student employees of the Office of Student Publications shall be selected as needed by the Director of Student Publications, subject to the approval of the Student Publications Board and the Vice-President of the College.

Student staff members of each publication shall be appointed or removed by the student editor or editors of the publication involved, subject to the approval of that member of the Student Publications Board charged with direct responsibility for the functioning of the individual publication. Appeals from any decision of an individual Board member shall be made to the Student Publications Board, through the Director of Student Publications.

### Minimum Requirements for Editors

All student editors of publications shall meet the following general requirements:

1. Academic classification as junior or senior. (Note that this requirement shall not apply to "summer editors," nor in cases

considered "emergency appointments.")

2. Freedom from academic probation or disciplinary action.

3. Must have clearly demonstrated above average achievement and ability.

4. A minimum of one year's experience on the staff of a student publication of the A. and M. College of Texas, and proved capacity to carry on the work of the publication in a manner deemed to be creditable by the Student Publications Board.

### Budgets

It shall be the duty of the director of Student Publications to prepare an annual budget with supporting budgets for the Office of Student Publications and for each student publication. The publications budgets shall be prepared in cooperation with and after consultation with the editor or editors of each publication. The budgets shall show revenue salaries and estimated commissions or hourly wages for staff members and all other estimated expenses. The budgets shall be submitted by the Student Publications Board to the business manager of the college for approval. All budget matters shall conform to college fiscal policies.

Staff budgets and individual salaries or other compensation of student editors and other staff members of the Office of Student Publications shall be fixed from time to time by the Student Publications Board, upon recommendation of the director of Student Publications and approval of the vice president of the college.

### OVERALL ORGANIZATIONAL RELATIONSHIPS

The organizational pattern established in the various provisions of these by-laws indicates the line of authority and communication from the vice president of the college to the various units in the Student Publications organization.

It is recommended that the dean of each major school of academic instruction set up an advisory committee for the magazine of that school. These advisory committees have no executive power, but through their relation with the Student Publications Board member representing the school, they provide a means of contact between the deans, the student council, and the students

of a particular school and the school-sponsored publication.

The policies of the Office of Student Publications will be cleared with the Student Publications Board; the policies of the Board will be cleared with the deans of the four major schools of academic instruction; and the policies of the deans of these schools will be cleared with the vice president of the college.

Among other duties, each faculty member of the Student Publications Board shall be directly responsible to the dean of his school for the operational procedure and subject matter content of the magazine sponsored by that school.

Student editors of the various publications report to and are responsible to the directors of Student Publications, except as to certain areas which have in these by-laws already been set forth as the specific responsibilities of the individual members of the Student Publications Board. The line of organization is, it is felt, one of close daily contact in all executive control and supervisory and advisory relationships.

### AMENDMENTS

Amendments of the by-laws of the Student Publications Board shall be recommended to the Executive Committee for approval or disapproval.
