Maj. Gen. Robert G. Gard, commanding general, eighth U.S. Army Corps (Reserve), will be host for the Fourth U.S. Army Reserve commanders and school commandants who will meet in Dallas, Texas, Oct. 17-18.

Industrial Writing Conference Set For A&M Nov. 18

An industrial writing and editing conference will be held at A&M November 14, D. D. Burchard, head of the Department of Journalism, said yesterday.

The conference, sponsored by the A&M Journalism Advisory Council, will be open to any Aggie who desires to attend. The sessions will be held from 9 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.

Frank Fields of Houston, chairman of the A&M Advisory Council, will preside at the conference. The program will be presented by members of the Houston Chapter of the International Council of Industrial Editors. They will speak and show films illustrating the part of industrial writing and editing in the fields of industrial publishing, public relations and advertising.

Among the industrial journalists on the program will be Harve Washington, publications director for Continental Oil Company. Walter Beach, publications director for Humble Oil and Refining Company, and Weldon Weekley of the Weekley and Valenti Advertising Agency, all of Houston.

Scientist To Speak At A&M Monday

Dr. Edward D. Goldberg of the University of California will speak on "Chemistry in the Oceans," Oct. 20, in the lecture room of the Chemistry Building.

Goldberg has participated in many of the large-scale oceanographic expeditions sponsored by the Scripps Institution of Oceanography.

His present researches are concerned primarily with the chemical compositions of sea water, or sediments, and of marine organisms.
