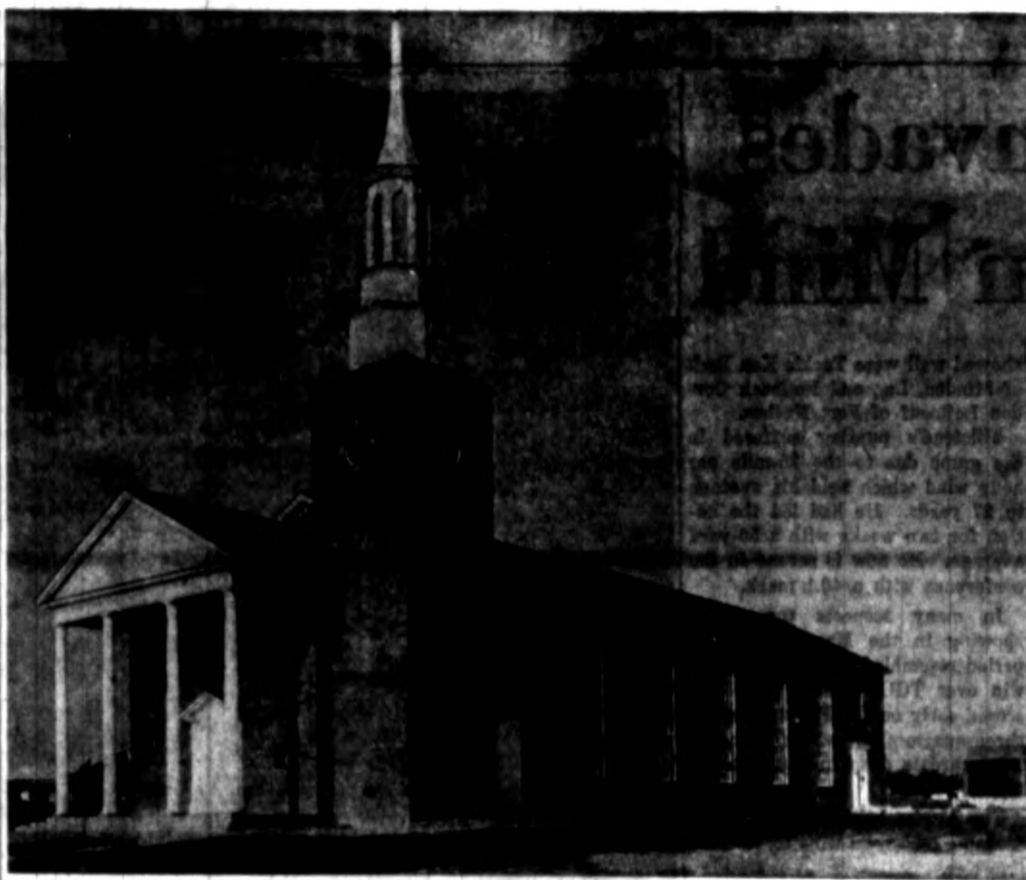
Entomology Prof To Give Insect Talk

\$280,000 CATHOLIC CHAPEL
... to be dedicated with Sunday Mass

Solemn Mass to Dedicate Catholic Chapel Sunday

The new \$280,000 St. Mary's Chapel located at North Gate will be dedicated in memory of Msgr. J. B. Gleissner, pastor of Catholic Aggies since 1904, with a Solemn High Mass Sunday morning at 11. Msgr. Gleissner, who worked with the students from 1904 until his death in 1953, first conceived the idea of a new church in 1944, when he saw that the present chapel which seated less than 300 was too small. He didn't live to see his dream realized.

The Most Rev. L. J. Reicher, D.D., Bishop of Austin, will officiate at the Mass Sunday and will be assisted by four former A&M students. They are Rev. Earnest Michalka of LaPorte, and Rev. James Nelson, Rev. James Demp-

sey and Rev. James Golasinski, all of Houston.

Rt. Rev. John J. Kearns of Waco, Vicar General of the Austin Diocese, will preach the dedication sermon. The Knights of St. Gregory and the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus will form an honor guard inside the chapel while 100 Catholic Aggies will form an honor guard around the church outside.

An informal banquet will be served to the clergy and dignitaries in St. Mary's Student Center after the Mass, and a dinner open to all will be served at the same time on the center grounds.

Funds for the new chapel were hard-coming because the church has no regular parishoners. A committee was formed in 1944 to

contact students, former students, parents, friends and Catholic organizations to ask for donations.

Construction on the colonial-style structure was begun in June, 1956 and completed this fall. The building seats 650.

The Rev. Tim J. Valenta, who came to Bryan in 1933 as a newly-ordained priest, is pastor of the chapel. The Rev. Charles Elmer is chaplain to the students.

Father Elmer announced that other Masses Sunday will be said at 7 and 8:30 a.m.
