Wins Four Saddles

Top Calf Roper Is 'A' Vet Fish

 A&M has among the ranks of its riding and roping enthusiasts a national champion high school calf roper. He is Lynn David Turner, "A" Veterinary freshman, who says that he has been handling a rope most of his life.

Turner, son of Mr. and Mrs. Emmett L. Turner of Gatesville, was reared on a ranch, and says that he received most of his encouragement to develop his roping talent from his older brother, Don, who is a senior Veterinary Medicine major at A&M.

Turner says that his biggest thrill in roping came at the Wharton High School Rodeo in 1956 when he won his first saddle. Since that time he has won three more saddles with his roping skill.

At Hallettsville, Turner won a scholarship and one of the saddles when he became the Texas high school champion calf roper for 1958. He went from there to the National High School Championship Rodeo in Sulphur, La., and became national champion. He competed with ropers from 20 states, roping and tying three calves in a total time of 42 seconds.
