A study of the topic has been prepared by the Library of Congress and the SCONA committee expects a copy of the study to arrive in the near future. This study will be submitted to the delegates along with other bibliographic material as an aid in preparing for the conference.

According to the SCONA procedure, any interested student may attend the sessions, but may not actually participate in the discussions, Pfeuffer said.

### Dr. Doak Likes to Help Young Scientists Learn

"The most electrifying experience in all my years at A&M is the chance to work on the scientific enrichment program which the Texas Education Agency is putting on," Dr. Clifton Doak, head of Department of Biology, said.

Doak was referring to the television panel he will moderate Oct. 26, at 8:30 a.m., on KBTX-TV, for gifted high school students interested in science who were in his class this summer.

Doak was born in Scurry County, near Snyder, in 1895. He spent his first two undergraduate years at A&M before enlisting in the service during World War I.

Immediately following the war he enrolled in North Texas State Teachers College where he received his B.S. degree in 1922.

"I wanted to come back to A&M but the semester was already in progress so I enrolled in North Texas State and it was a lucky thing that I did. For it was in Denton that I met my bride to be, Henryetta," he said.

"I wanted to come back to A&M, 1928; and Ph.D. at Illinois, 1933. He joined the faculty at A&M in 1926 and became the second head

### Equipment Course To Be Held Here

The largest class to date is expected for the Heavy Construction Equipment Operators Course which begins Nov. 3, conducted under the auspices of the Engineering Extension Service.

Approximately 18 to 20 men are expected to enroll for this course which consists of two schools. One school is of six weeks duration and covers crawler tractors, motor graders and motor scrapers. The other school is of eight weeks duration and covers boom equipment, such as drag lines and clam shells. Both schools will be held in the area immediately behind Eastwood Airport on college property.

This course is the last of six courses which have been taught in the past year. Anthony L. Kramer is coordinator of the program and Larue W. Jones is Chief Instructor for the program. Assisting these men are James J. Wallace, Charlie Brannon, Heston Thoin W. Jones.

The charge for this course is \$350 for the six-week school and \$500 for the eight-week school. Anyone desiring to attend either of these schools should contact Alvin W. Jones of the Engineering Extension Service.
