Martin Luther Film To Be Shown Here

"Martin Luther," the half-million dollar feature film produced by a cast and crew of seven nations on locations in West Germany, will be shown tomorrow at the New Interfaith Chapel.

The film, dealing with the 16th century monk who defied excommunication and the stake in his demand for religious reform, was produced by Louis de Rochemont Associates.

Title role is played by Niall MacGinnis, British actor, who heads a cast and crew of 500 from the U. S., France, Ireland, England, Scotland, Germany and Austria.

Lothar Wolff, DeRochemont veteran, produced the film on location in towns, castles and churches of West Germany. Film was directed by Irving Pichel of Hollywood, who played one of the key roles.

Script is based on Catholic and Protestant sources and leans heavily on historic documents for its dialogue.

Support of museums in Berlin, Mainz, Weisbaden and Brettan were enlisted for authentic costuming and reconstruction of scenes. Music was furnished by the Munich Philharmonic Orchestra.
