

New Award to Be Given Top Scholastic Outfit

A new award, presented by the Houston A&M Mother's Club to the Corps of Cadets will be presented this year to the squadron or company housed in a dormitory which shows the highest academic rating and retention power, Col. Joe E. Davis, Commandant, said yesterday.

The award, which will consist of a flag, was an idea of the Houston A&M Mother's Club, who thought the award would be a good incentive for outfits to improve their academic achievement. It

will be known as the George P. F. Jouine Award.

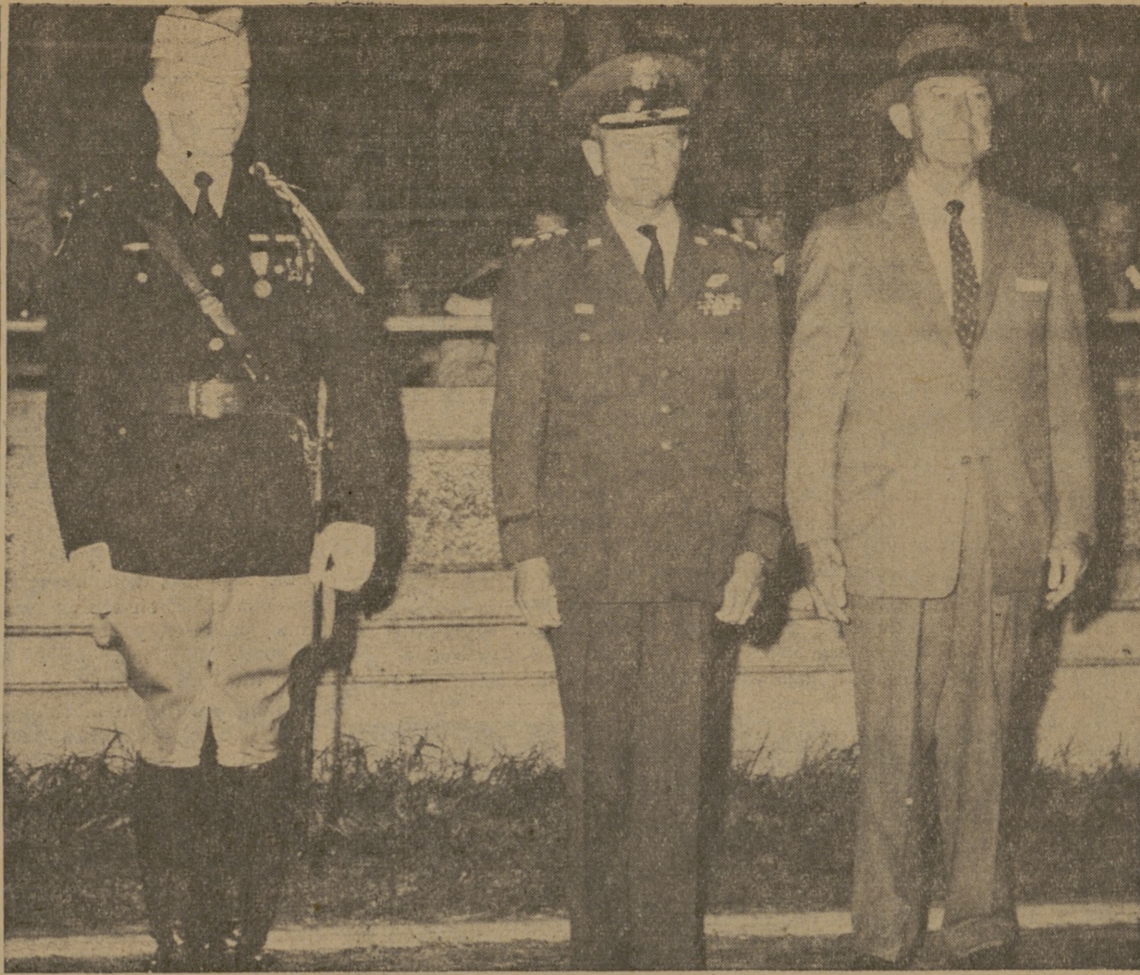
Criterion for the selection of the unit winning the award will be based on academic achievement and retention power, Davis said.

A committee of architectural students are now making a design for the flag, which will be presented at Mother's Day Ceremonies, he said.

The award was named after Jouine because of his distinguished career in the military service and as a business man.

Jouine graduate in 1907 with a B.S. degree in civil engineering. At A&M he was a member of the Ross Volunteers, the student council, treasurer of the senior class and a cadet first lieutenant in 'B' Infantry. He was designated the most military student for his junior and senior years.

Jouine served in the French Army during World War I, entering as a private and emerging 42 months later as a first lieutenant, receiving 14 French, 1 British, 1 Belgian, and 4 unit decorations.

(Continued from Page 1) conservative appeal than did Al-

ger's. Both campaigned vigorously. Whittenburg, West Texas rancher, oil man and publisher, developed a major plank aimed at election of federal judges, including those on the Supreme Court.

Yarborough campaigned very little until the final week or so of the race, and then his appeals to voters were in general terms.

The offices of Texas' most noted congressmen, Senate Majority Leader Lyndon Johnson and House Speaker Sam Rayburn, were not at stake. Johnson's term does not expire until 1960. Rayburn faced no opposition in the Democratic primary on the general election.

The amendment proposals were these:

1. Provide annual legislative sessions.
2. Permitting elective officers of

the county or precinct to participate in a retirement plan.

3. Permitting commissioners court to fill a vacancy in the positions of county judge and justice of the peace only until the next election.

4. Preventing a four-year officeholder from running for another office if more than a year of his term remains.

5. Allowing cities to elect officers to four-year terms instead of the present two.

6. Setting up pensions for retired Texas Rangers and their widows.

7. Permitting the Legislature to appropriate money for advertising the state.

8. Providing hospital and emergency medical care for persons on the state assistance rolls.

9. Permitting the Legislature to create hospital districts in Amarillo and in Wichita and Jefferson Counties.

AIR FORCE ROTC CREDIT FOR PREVIOUS ACTIVE MILITARY SERVICE

To clarify a misunderstanding which may exist among some students who are veterans regarding credit in the AFROTC program for previous active military service, Air Force Regulation 45-48 states: "On the basis of previous honorable active service (other than six-months active duty for training in the Air Force, Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard, a cadet may request a waiver of the basic course, or any portion thereof, required for entrance into the advanced course. The Professor of Air Science may then waive so much of the basic course as he considers equivalent to the active service training, provided that he does not waive any portion which the cadet can complete prior to entrance into the advanced course. To satisfy entrance requirements for the advanced course, veterans entering an institution at freshman or sophomore level who desire a commission through Air Force ROTC will be required to take in phase with nonveteran contemporaries the remaining portion of the basic program."

Veterans who contemplate obtaining an Air Force commission are advised to contact the Professor of Air Science or the Operations & Training Section of the Air Science Department regarding their eligibility and prospects for commission.
