Supreme Court to Test Law

TUCUMCARI, N. M.—A supersonic, four-engined B58 jet, the nation's newest bomber, crashed near here Tuesday. The three crewmen parachuted. An unidentified lieutenant-colonel who was injured, was taken to Cannon Air Force Base, Clovis

It was the first crash of the nation's new Hustler bombers, which travel more than twice the speed of sound.

An Air Force spokesman said the big delta-winged craft 3:13,14. was on a test flight from Carswell Air Force Base, Fort Worth, Tex., at the time.

B47 Crashes in Florida

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla.—A jet bomber crashed and exploded in Tampa Bay Tuesday night, about 300 yards offshore from a thickly populated St. Petersburg residential

No survivors were found in the first hour of search. MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa tentatively identified the craft as a six-engine B47 jet bomber from MacDill. A spokesman said B47s usually carry three-man crews.

AUSTIN (P) — Gov. Price Daniel estimated Tuesday that it would take at least 175 to 185 million dollars in extra taxes to erase the present deficit and finance state govern-

The governor told a press conference that his estimate was based on the present estimate of a 55-million-dollar estimate at the end of the fiscal year, Sept. 1, 1959, and on maintaining the current level of spending with a minimum of new expenditures

He said he would ask the Legislature meeting in January for temporary tax financing to wipe out the current deficit and for permanent new taxes to handle the estimated additional 60 to 65 million dol-+
