

Assn. Council ruled yesterday that Don Fuell, a controversial figure in footbal since he was declared meligible at Auburn, can regain his eligibility if he transfers to a college which has not violated the rules in recruiting him.

Fuell, former star high school quarterback, was declared ineligible by the Southeastern Conference on the grounds that rules regarding NCAA principles on amateurism and administering financial aid had been violated when he was induced to enroll at Auburn.

The NCAA placed Auburn on probation until September, 1961, because of the activities of a representative of the institution in these violations. Fuell filed suit in an unsuccessful effort to have his eligibility restored.

A question from Mississippi Southern College brought Wednesday's ruling from the NCAA Council, the 18-man policy-making group of the college organization. Fuell still is enrolled at Auburn as a third-semester student, but the implication was that he might transfer if he received an OK on he eligibility question.
