Father Charles Elmer, Catholic chaplain, has announced a change in masses which will remain in effect through the spring semester with the exception of holiday weekends.

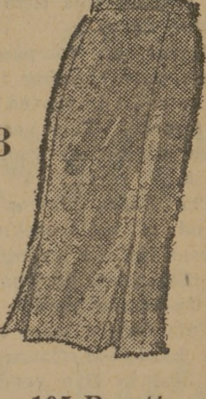

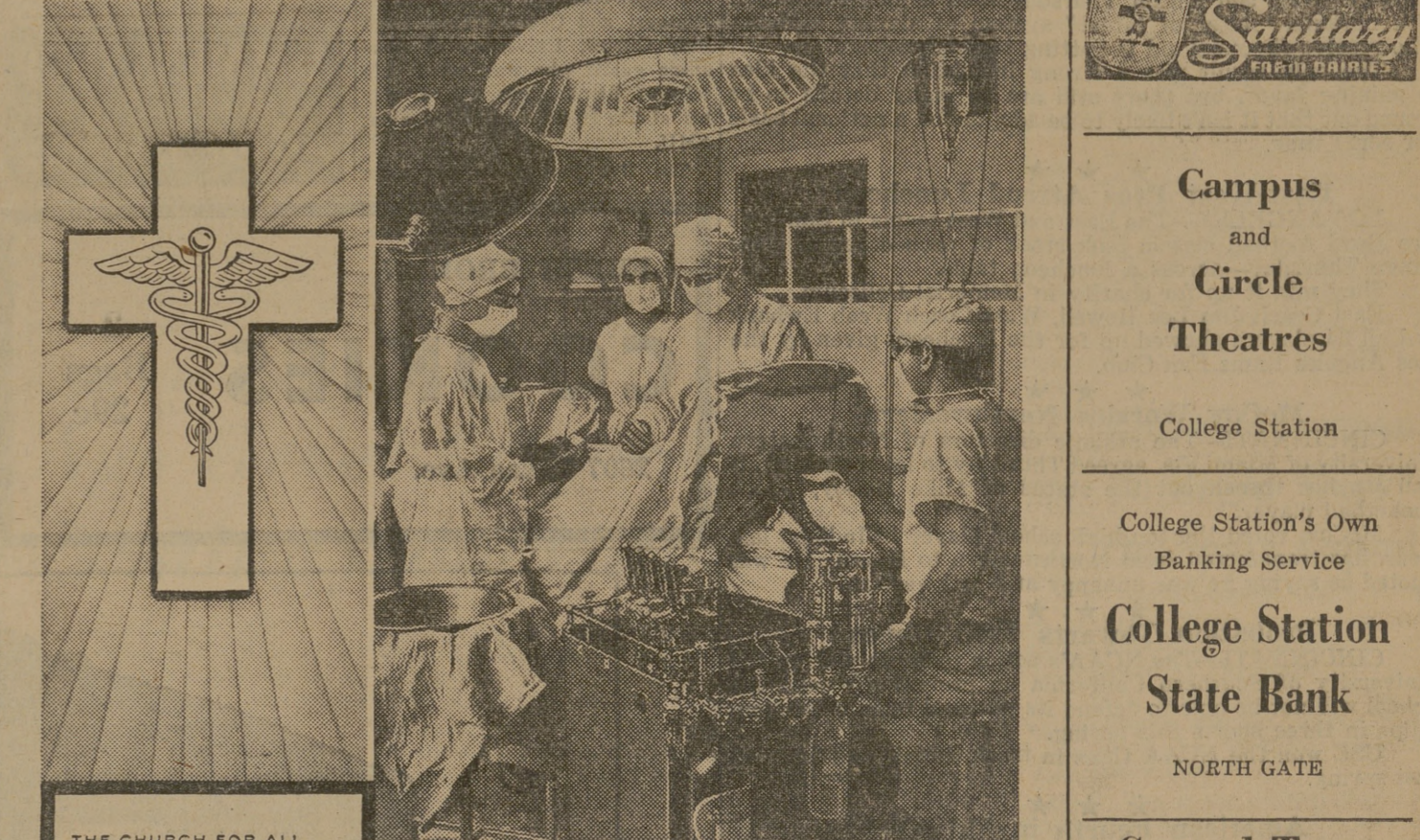
