College Receives Math Fellowships

A&M has been awarded four fellowships in applied mathematics by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare under the New National Defense Act, Dr. J. B. Page, dean of the College and the Graduate School, announced today.

The fellowships, effective September, 1959, are four of only 160 awarded throughout the United States.

Applicants for these fellowships must have a good record on their bachelor's degrees and mathematics at least through differential equa-

tions. The stipends will be \$2,000 for the first year, \$2,200 for the second and \$2,400 for the third year, plus \$400 for each year on account of each dependent.

Under the New National Defense Act normal tuition and out-of-state fees will be paid and in addition A&M can receive direct payment of up to \$2,500 for each of the four fellowships to help defray the institutional expense of training the graduate student.

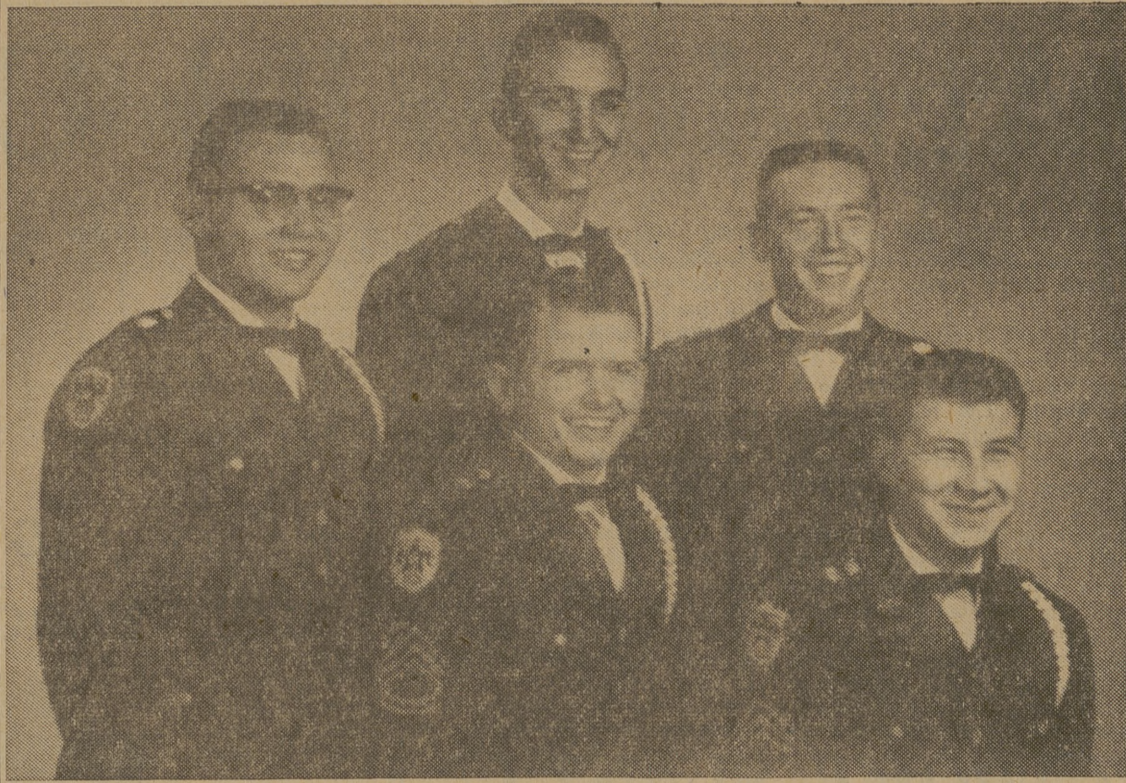
Under the fellowships students may be employed in teaching, research or similar activities up to one-fourth time during one of the three years of his fellowship or up to one-half time during one semester and he may receive payment for such work. Moreover he may receive an additional scholarship or beneficiary aid from his institution.
