The team, organized in 1947, is

composed of freshmen from both Army and Air Force, ROTC units. All members drill after 5 p.m. on a strictly voluntary basis.

These freshmen not only have to be on their toes on the drill field, they also have to be sharp in their studies by keeping at least a 1.5 grade point ratio. Any member who posts below one point at mid-semester is dismissed from

the team.

Last year during the fall semester the drill team marched at the three home football games and the Dallas Corps trip. During the spring semester, the most active season for competition marching, the team had a new experience when it traveled by plane to Houston to participate in the Armed Forces Day Parade. This was the first time in its 12 years of existence that the drill team had made a plane trip.

This spring semester also holds a busy schedule for the team. On March 14, it will perform in Area H competition at Texas Christian University. This will be an Air Force-sponsored contest between only Southwest Conference drill teams.

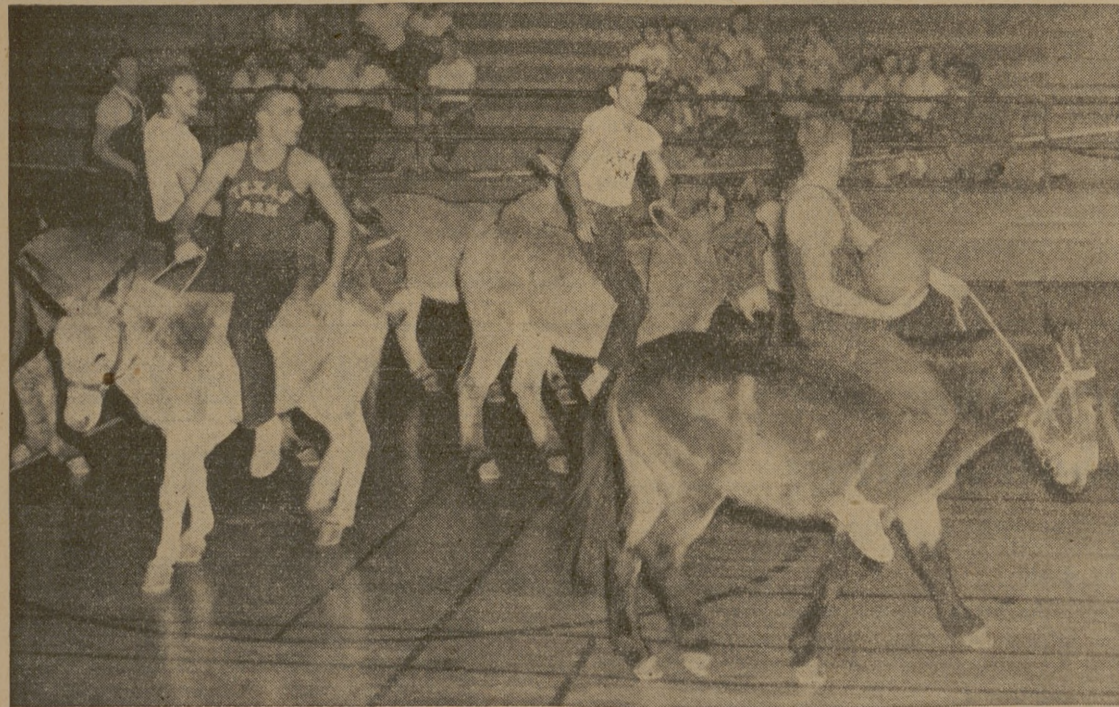
The drill team also has an invitation to march in the Fiesta Flambeau at San Antonio, plus a standing invitation to perform in the annual Splash Day celebration at Galveston.

Cadet Maj. Hoy Richards, an industrial engineering major and ex-Marine, is completing his second year as instructor for the drill team. Richards, who volunteers his time for the team, is hoping for a drill team to develop in the future which will be a separate unit from the freshman team and the Ross Volunteers, which is restricted to juniors and seniors. Richards said this team could be open to all upper classmen. It could be a good representative of the whole college in competition drill meets, Richards added.

Faculty coordinator for the Freshman Drill Team is Air Force Capt. Grange S. Coffin Jr., who also volunteers his time to organize trips and transportation for the team.

The team's commander is Ben B. Rice, a freshman, ex-Marine in "A" Ordnance. Executive officer for the team is Gregory A. Garcia of Squadron 6. David G. Lee, a freshman who posted a 2.93 last semester, is the team's first sergeant.

**Carol Heiss Rallies in Bid For World Skating Honors**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (AP)—Carol Heiss rallied magnificently from a mild setback Wednesday and made a runaway of her bid for a fourth world women's figure skating championship.

The 19-year-old college coed from Ozone Park, N.Y., jumped in

to an insurmountable 73.5-point lead over Austria's Hanna Walter in the school figures with 771.9 points and threatened to post a record margin in the free skating phase Thursday night.

The six compulsory figures, skated the last two days, make up 60 per cent of the scoring for the title with free skating counting 40 per cent. Miss Heiss is rated the most brilliant free skater in the world.
