



Both are senior chemistry students conducting research on aminosugars under the supervision of Dr. H. K. Zimmerman Jr., associate professor in the Department of Chemistry. Tefteller held a similar scholarship last fall.

The scholarship program was established in order to further the training of chemistry majors by encouraging them to do original research.

To be considered for the scholarship, a student must demonstrate an interest in research, maintain a B average, and, if awarded a scholarship, must show satisfactory progress at his level of training. The Department of Chemistry

encourages all chemistry majors to participate in its undegraduate research program, said Zimmerman.

In addition to the scholarship holders, students presently doing undergraduate research are John Herrin, Jack Frain, Robert F Smith and J. R. Johnson.


