## Group Elects Prof To Trustee Board

Dr. William C. Banks, professor of veterinary medicine and surgery, has been elected a member of the Board of Trustees of the Southwestern Society of Nuclear Medicine.

The election was held during the fourth annual meeting recently of the society in New Orleans.

The Southwestern Society of Nuclear Medicine is composed of members from Louisiana, Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma and other states of the Southwest. Of the 125 members only three are veterinarians.

The election of Dr. F. T. Lynd, assistant professor of veterinary pathology, as a member at the New Orleans meeting gives the A&M School of Veterinary Medicine, two of the three veterinarians in the society.

With the development of nuclear science and its application in the fields of medicine, Banks and Lynd became interested in the applications to veterinary medicine. They both have studied at the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies and have been active in the planning of the Nuclear Science Center at A&M.

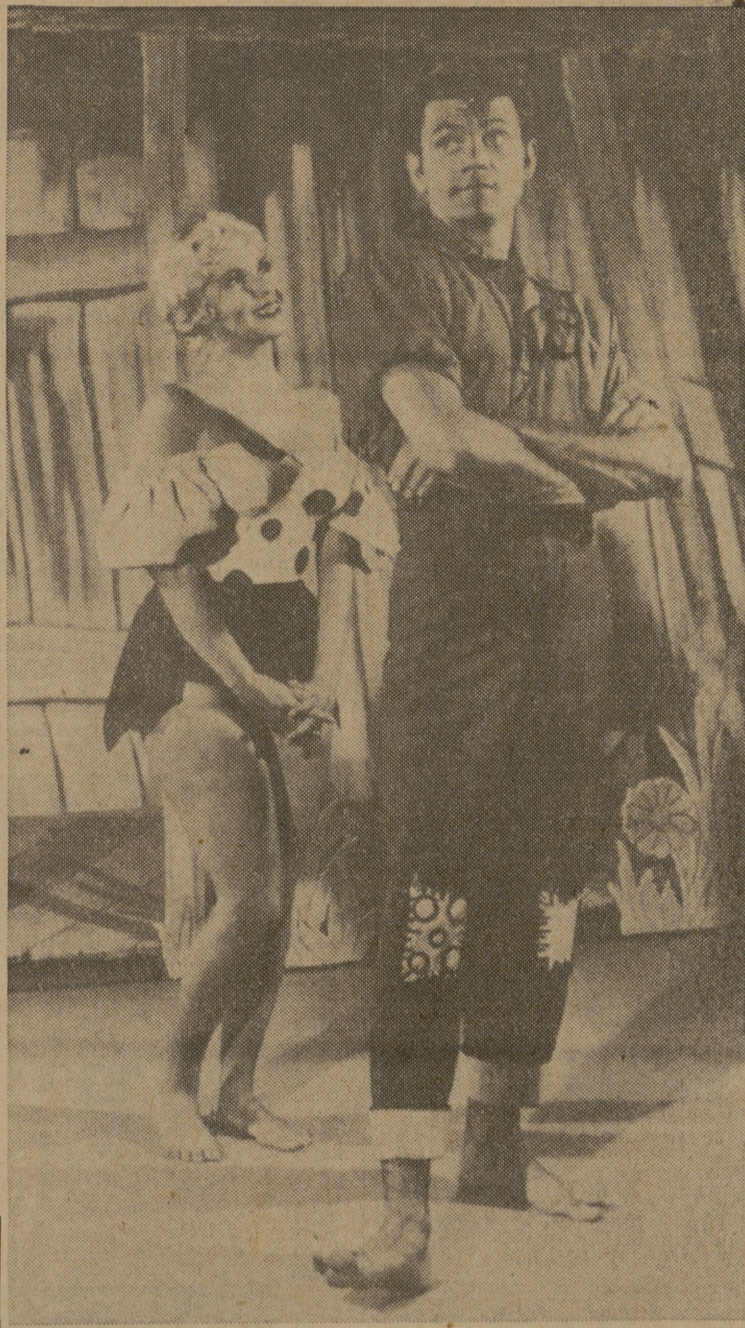

## A&M Gets Grant For Safety Research

A \$10,000 grant, to assist A&M College in continuing research into the relationship of freeway design and traffic accidents, has been made by the Automotive Safety Foundation.

The grant was announced this week, at a meeting of the Western Petroleum Refiners Association, at

San Antonio.

The Foundation is a non-profit organization, supported by private industry, for fostering safe and efficient highway transportation.

Research engineers at A&M and in the Texas Transportation Institute are currently engaged in a number of studies on highway and freeway design aimed at improving traffic flow, reducing accidents and making more efficient illumination patterns for heavily traveled freeways.

# German Engineer Assumes Teaching Position at A&M

Albert Gail, an aeronautical engineer from Germany, has joined the ranks of the A&M staff to teach aerodynamics and do research on the vertical take-off type aircraft.

Gail was born in Hanover, Germany in 1909. He studied at the Institute of Technology in Munich, Germany, where he obtained the "Diplom-Ingenieur" degree, approximately equivalent to a masters degree. After completing his studies, he worked on the Messerschmitt airplane.

In 1937, two years before Germany was at war again, Gail left Germany and came to the United States.

After settling in America, he worked for United Airlines from 1937-1939. From 1940-44, he taught at Georgia Tech, the University of Minnesota, the University of Michigan and Illinois Tech. He returned to industry in 1944 and remained there until 1947. During that period he worked for the McDonnell Aircraft Corp., where he was chief of helicopter research.
