Red Chinese Communes Face Money Trouble

TOKYO (A)-Red China dis closed Tuesday its peasant communes are in trouble and will need both a subsidy and tax relief to bail them out.

Chairman Mao Tze-tung launched the communes last year with the hope that these big camps now harnessing the labor of large percentage of China's 500 million peasants, would give quick mpetus to his progam for a "great eap forward."

Sober facts came out in a report of Finance Minister Li Hsien-nien on the 1959 budget to the National People's Congress, the rubberstamp Parliament, in Peiping.

Radio Peiping said:

By order of Sao and the Comnunist party Central Committee, subsidy of a billion yuan will be used for pump-priming in comnunes and production brigades which are lagging.

The subsidy—the equivalent of 435 million dollars by Peiping's reckoning-indicates that many are in straitened circumstances.

In addition, the 7 per cent agricultural tax of 1958 will be cut to 5.2 per cent.

With all this, the communes are expected to contribute a smaller percentage to Red China's overall revenue that they did last year.
