criminal penalties for any union leader violating those rights.

On a 47-46 roll call vote, it wrote into the Kennedy labor bill a series of such guarantees sponsored by Sen. John L. McClellan (D-Ark).

McClellan contended the Kennedy anti-corruption bill "does not adequately meet the needs of union members for the protection of their rights" from the sort of abuses spotlighted by McClellan's committee, the Senate Labor-Management Committee.

In rebuttal, Sen. John F. Kennedy (D-Mass) argued that state laws, the Taft-Hartley labor management act and provisions of his bill offer full protection to the rights of union members.

Thirty-two Republicans, including Senate GOP Leader Everett Dirksen of Illinois, joined with 15 Democrats, most of them

Southerners, to give McClellan his tight-squeeze victory. Forty-four Democrats, including Senate Democratic Leader

Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas, voted with Kennedy. The other two "no" votes came from Republican Sens. Jacob K. Javits of New York and William Langer of North

Dakota. McClellan's amendment would extend to union members these guarantees:

1. Equal voting rights and equal protection of a union's rules.

2. Freedom of speech so a union member could express his 3. Freedom of assembly.

4. Freedom from arbitrary fiwithout a majority vote of memregular meeting.

5. Protection of the right to sue. 6. Safeguards against improper




