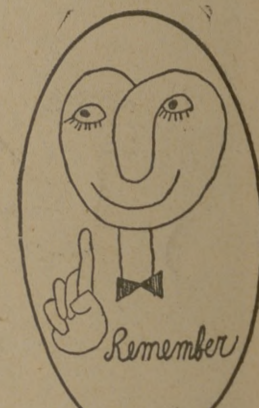
Rifle Club matches each month in which they have won several medals.
