Storage Space Set Aside For Use During Summer

Students who wish to store trunks, lamps and other personal belongings during the summer may use either the basement of Dorm 3 or Ramp K of Walton Hall.

All baggage will be stored at 40 cents per piece for containers not exceeding foot locker size. Other pieces will be stored at proportionate rates with a minimum of 20 cents per separate article. Bicycles, typewriters, radios, television sets and items not in boxes will be

stored at \$1 each. The storage fee will be paid at the time of storing.

Students are urged to remove all items from storage as soon as the fall semester begins and if the items aren't picked up by Oct. 1, 1959, they will be disposed of.

Students who will attend the first summer term and not the second may store baggage in Ramp K of Walton Hall, July 17 from 4-5 p.m. The schedule for students who wish to store their baggage for the whole summer starts May 25 from 4-5 p.m. On May 26-30 students may store baggage from 11-12 a.m. and from 4-5 p.m.
