

The Little League Corner

The Red Sox widened their lead on first place in American League South action last week as the Sox took three straight wins to clinch at least a tie for the league title in the first half of play.
At the end of Monday's action the Red Sox had a 6-1 record, two games ahead of the Senators and the White Sox, who are deadlocked with 4-3 records. The Orioles, who have had good hitting to get men on base but haven't had the pitching to back up the hitters, are resting in last place with a 0-7 record.
Last Wednesday Walter Varvel and the Senators set down the White Sox 16-0. The Sox got only three hits off Varvel while the Senator slugger pounded out a homer and drove in four runs. In the second game the Red Sox whammed the Orioles, 11-6. The Orioles got the hitting and led 6-4 at one time, but the pitching faltered and the Red Sox rallied to win. League leader in hitting Hubert Hearne went three-for-four to lead the Sox.
Friday found a red hot pitchers battle between Hearne of the Red Sox and Joe Powell of the White Sox. At the end of regulation play the score was knotted at 1-1. Under Little League rules of pitching both hurlers had to be relieved. The first pitch of the bottom of the 7th sailed over the centerfield fence as Hearne tagged them all

for the game winning hit. In the second game the Senators behind the four hit hurling of Larry Godfrey stopped the Orioles, 15-0. Eleven walks, eight errors and crafty baserunning helped the Sens to a great advantage as Varvel took over the RBI lead with a three-for-five night and five RBIs.
Monday the Senators and the Red Sox mixed it up in a very important tilt as the Sox used Hearne's sixth homer and an unearned run in the fifth to down the Sens 4-3. In the second tilt, grand slam homers by Dick Pewthers of the Orioles and Powell of the White Sox highlighted the White Sox' 10-6 victory over the hapless Orioles. The Orioles loaded the sacks with two out after Pewthers' hit in the sixth but couldn't get the timely hit. Randy Hall picked up his third victory in the first tilt as he bested previously undefeated Varvel. In the second contest Duke Butler took the victory over Pewthers.
Last night the Red Sox played the Orioles and the White Sox played the Senators and tomorrow night the Red Sox battle the White Sox and the Orioles the Senators. After Friday's action the League takes a week's layoff for Boy Scout Week before resuming play.

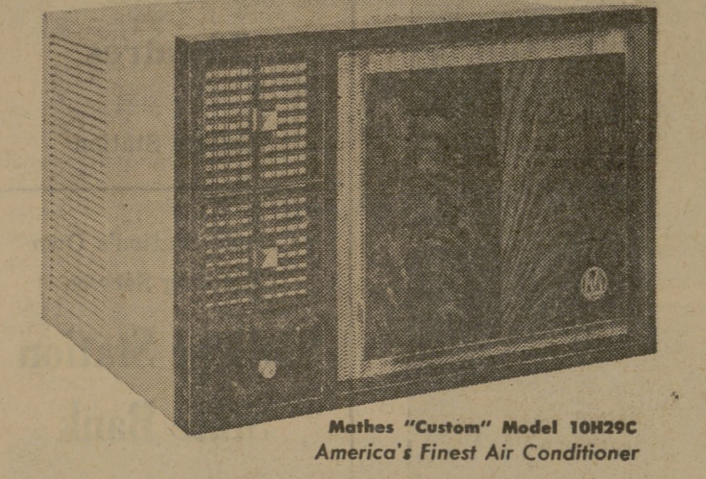
