Top Water Scientists To Hold Meeting Here

Top Texas and U. S. water scientists will discuss phases of Texas water problems, ranging from contamination by radioactive fallout to water requirements for irrigated farming and industrial uses, at a two-day meeting at A&M, Sept. 10-11.

Delegates to the conference, the only such annual statewide meeting of its type in Texas, will register on the afternoon of Wednesday, Sept. 9, and regular sessions of the meeting will be held on the two following days.

The conference is divided into three major sections, devoted to water uses and standards, reclamation and reuse of water and equities in water utilization.

Wednesday speakers include Dr.

Conrad P. Straub, chief of radiological health research activities, division of radiological health, Robert A. Taft Sanitary Engineering Center, Cincinnati, Ohio, who will discuss radioactive fallouts as they relate to water supplies and to agriculture.

Other first-day speakers will be R. G. Herzik, Jr., director of the division of sanitary engineering of the Texas State Department of Health, Austin. Dr. D. Wynne Thorne, director of the Utah Agricultural Experiment Station. Logan, Utah; C. A. Burslen, associate agronomist for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station's Weslaco substation; Dr. Clarence C. Cottam, director of the Welder Wildlife Refuge, J. Frank Gray, farmer and member of the State Soil Conservation Board, Lubbock.

Also, Dr. C. H. Connell, professor of sanitation, department of preventive medicine and public health, University of Texas Medical Branch, Galveston; and Douglas E. Noll, staff engineer for Hagan Chemicals and Controls, Inc., Pittsburgh, Pa.

On Thursday, delegates will hear Dr. Frank L. Parker, engineering leader, Health Physics Division, Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, discuss "Dispersal of Radioactive Contaminants in Fresh Water."

Other speakers will include Dr. Frederic O. Sargent, land economist, A&M; Dr. Alan Loshe, consulting geologist, Corpus Christi; Bernard B. Berger, chief of the water supply and water pollution research department of health, education and welfare, Robert A. Taft, Sanitary Engineering Center, Cincinnati, Ohio; and Dr. Leo B. Merrill, range management expert for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station's Sonora substation.

Approximately 200 hydrologists, industrial and municipal reservoir engineers, health agency officials, and representatives of federal, state and municipal agencies concerned with Texas water problems are expected to attend the A&M meeting.

Mary Anna Grimes Retires From Experiment Station Here

Mary Anna Grimes is retiring from the professional staff of the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station after more than 32 years of service.

Miss Grimes has worked full time on clothing and textile research, mainly with cotton fibers and fabrics.

Serving as acting head of the Department of Rural Home Research during 1954-56 and as professor since 1947, Miss Grimes has written more than 50 publications, including numerous articles for scientific journals, and has presented many papers before professional organizations.

Miss Grimes was born in Greenwood, Mo. and received her bachelor and master degrees from Kansas State University. She did graduate work at the University of Chicago and the Massachusetts

Institute of Technology. Before joining the TAES staff in 1927 as a textiles and clothing specialist, she taught in high schools and colleges in Kansas and Iowa.

In addition to serving as secretary and board member of the Texas Agricultural Workers Association, Miss Grimes held various offices in the Texas Home Economics Association and the American Home Economics Association. She is an active member of the American Association of Textile Chemists and Colorists, British Textile Institute, U. S. Textile Institute and the American Association for the Advancement of Scientists.

Miss Grimes is a member of the honorary societies of Sigma Xi and Phi Kappa Phi and is recognized in the American Men of Science, a book listing outstanding scientists.
