

# **Figures Show Enrollment Up** This Semester

Texas A&M has again shown an increase in enrollment this year. As registration ended last Saturday, the figure was 7,076. This is a jump of 31 over last year's total of 7,045.

Figures for the last five years show the 1956 enrollment still the highest during this period with 7,113 registering. In 1957, 7,016 students enrolled in the fall semester.

The registrar's office at Arlington State College also shows an increase in enrollment since last year. The figure at the end of enrollment was 6,528 in comparison with last year's 5,173.

Stewart Chilton, registrar at John Tarleton State College reports that with three days of registration left, 1,020 students have registered there.




