Excused List Eligibility Set

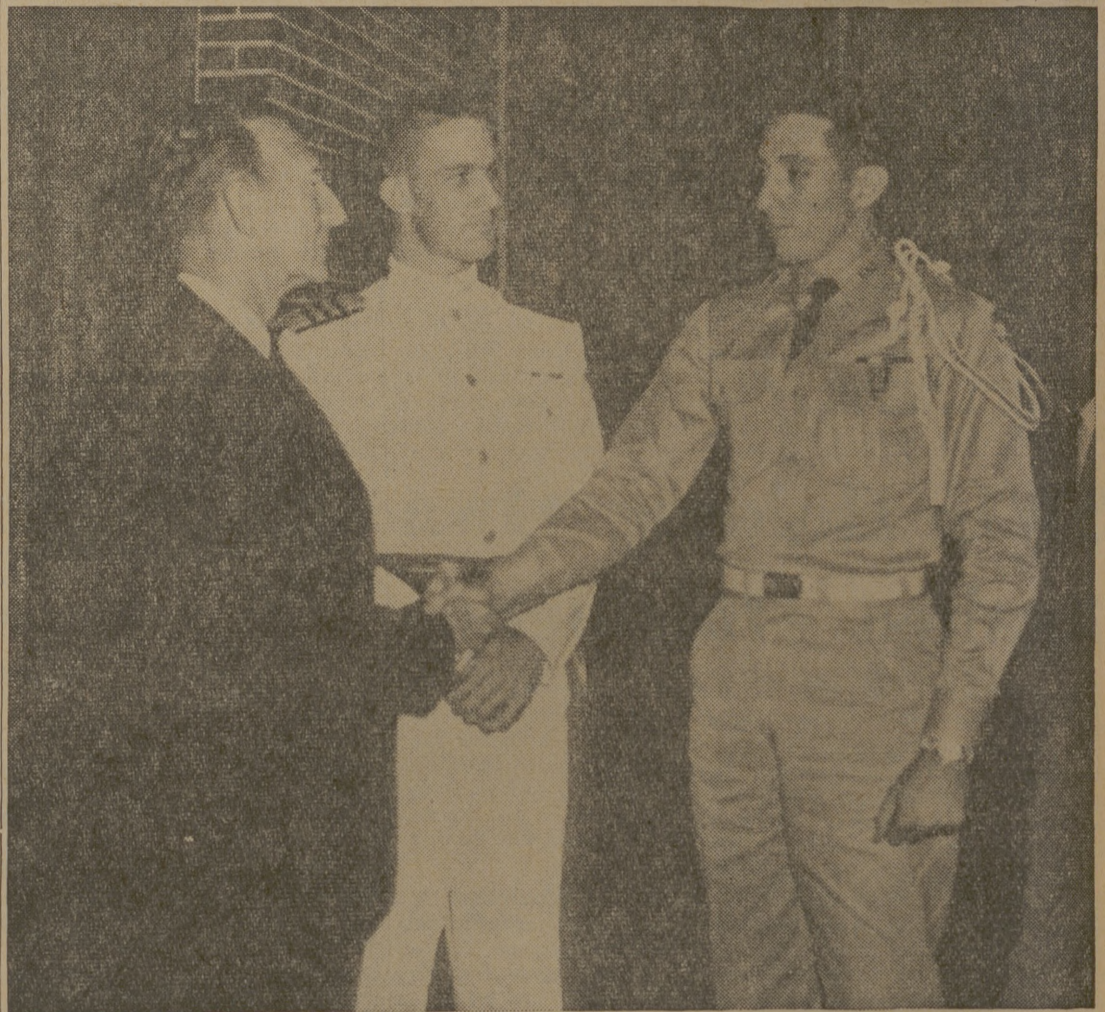
Only students who are absent on official college business or sick at the College Hospital or sick at home may be placed on the college's official excused list. Dean of Students James P. Hannigan said this morning.
