Nominations for Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges will be accepted starting next Monday. Applications for the honor must be filed by Nov. 6.

Forms will be available in the Memorial Student Center post office area, the Commandant's Office and the Department of Student Affairs in the Housing Office.

The applications may be filed by the student himself, another classmate, members of the faculty or members of the college staff.

Deans of A&M degree-granting schools and the Dean of Students will be sent letters inviting them to nominate a student for the highest recognition offered by any college.

To be considered for Who's Who a student must be a senior (95 hours), have a grade point ratio of 1.50, be active in campus activities, show qualities of leadership and be popular with fellow students.

A student may be considered for Who's Who only once.

Approximately 35 students from A&M will be selected from nominations sometime in December. Those selected will be announced before the Christmas holidays.
