Kyle Scholarship Open to Agricultural Students

The Dean Kyle Scholarship Award is being made available this year for the first time to A&M School of Agriculture students. Dr. R. E. Leighton, professor in the Department of Dairy Science and chairman of the School of Agriculture's scholarship committee, said any junior currently enrolled in agriculture is eligible to compete for the award. He said the scholarship, involving about \$180, will be made on the basis of scholarship, leadership and need. The deadline for application is Nov. 1 and forms can be obtained from the dean of agriculture or from Leighton. Money for the scholarship is provided by the E. J. Kyle family. Kyle is former dean of agriculture here.

Hunger Strike Against ROTC Ends
 BERKELEY, Calif.—(AP)—The 18-year-old son of an Air Force colonel ended his hunger strike against compulsory military training five days ahead of schedule. Faint and weakened by hunger—he lost eight pounds in his 50-hour fast—Frederick L. Moore Jr. of Arlington, Va., said he thought he had accomplished his purpose. More than 1,000 students at the University of California signed his petition to make Reserve Officers Training Corps instruction voluntary.
