Agriculture Group Helps in Building **New Onion Dryer**

In cooperation with the Department of Plant Physiology and Pathology, A&M, the Lockwood Conveyor Corp. at Hereford, Texas, has designed and built a 576,000 BTU gas-fired infrared onion drier.

The drier has a capacity of 350 bags of onions per hour.

Gas-fired infrared drying systems are showing promise for several agricultuarl commodities, rice being one of them, according to Dr. D. W. Rosberg, associate professor in the A&M Department of Plant Physiology and Pathology, and Dr. H. W. Schroeder of the U. S. Department of Agriculture.
