The scientist was a field geologist from 1921-23 and consulting geologist from 1923-24 with the Oklahoma Geological Survey; instructor in geology, 1924-25, assistant professor, 1925-27, associate professor, 1927-39 and professor from 1939 to the present at the University of Texas.



He is a fellow of the Geological Society, Association of Petroleum Geology and Mineralogy Society.

Bullard's research has been on sedimentation and shore process along the Gulf of Mexico coast; volcanology; igneous geology; Paleozoic and Cretaceous stratig-
