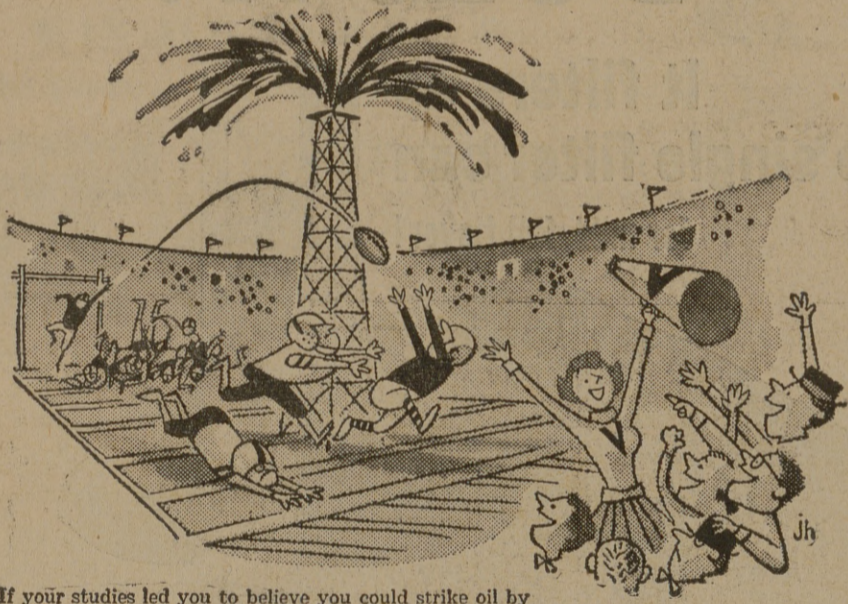
We shudder a little as we wonder if there is anything that remains the same.

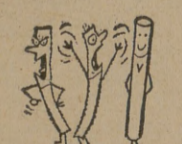

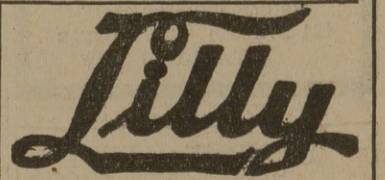
