prayer group tonight, starting at 8.

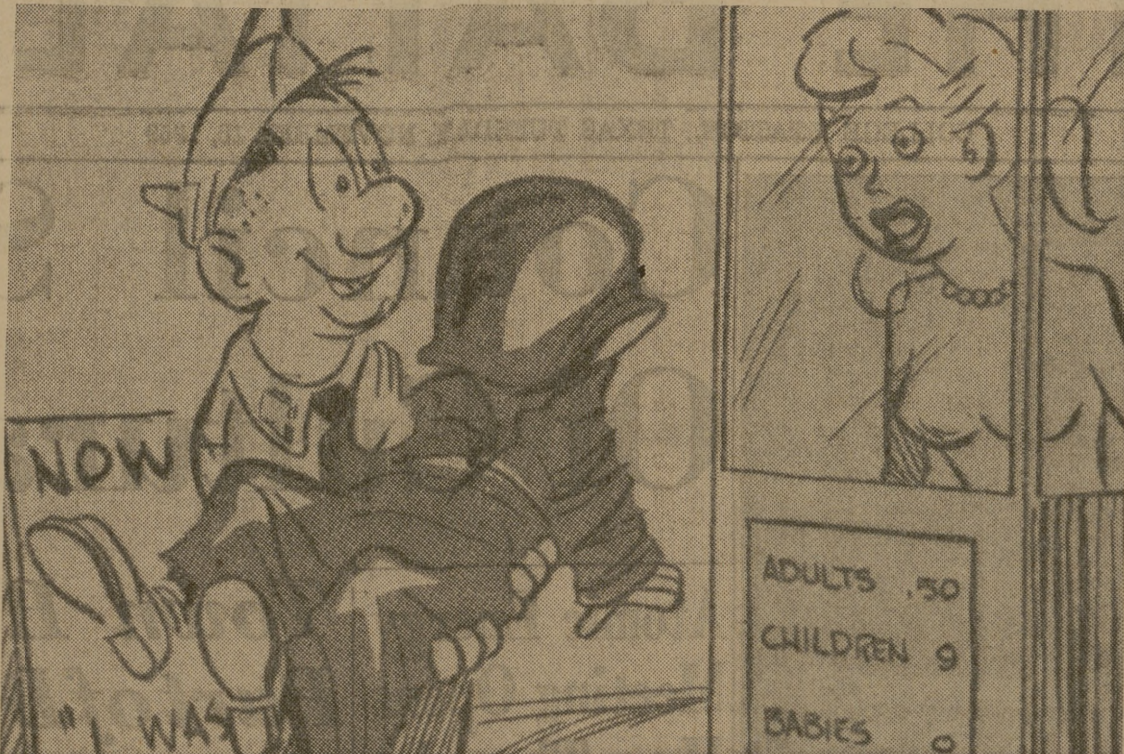
Rio Grande Valley Home Town Club will meet at 7:30 tonight in Room 2-D of the MSC.

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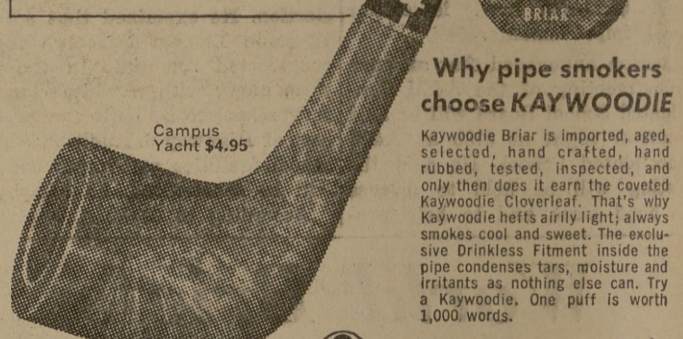
