

Nigerian Leader to Attend Religious Meetings Here

A leader in international student movements, Bola Ige of Nigeria, will be on the campus for a series of meetings with religious leaders and students on Monday and Tuesday.

Ige's visit is a part of his tour of college and universities in the United States and Canada to interpret the *Economical Student Conference* to students, and to urge their participation in the "life and mission of the church" throughout the world.

He serves as secretary of the Nigerian Student Christian Movement. He is a layman, an active member of the Anglican Church, and has recently received a degree in law from the University of London. He recently attended the "pilot" conference of the World Student Christian Federation in Rangoon, India.

Local meetings during Ige's visit will include a Sunday evening supper meal for students of all denominations at the Wesley Foundation at five o'clock Sunday afternoon. A breakfast hour is set for 6:30 Monday morning for interested students and faculty members. The meeting is scheduled to be held at the campus YMCA building.
