Martin Ruby, a tackle on the 1943 team that posted a 7-2-1 record, was selected by Martin as a tackle on his team. According to the records, Ruby was neither all-SWC nor a candidate for all-American honors while at A&M.

Joe Routt, a guard on the 1937-36 teams, was picked to side Ruby on the line. Routt was all-American two years at Aggieland and all-SWC twice. Routt was killed in action during WW II.

At quarterback Martin put the great Joel Hunt, the little halfback-quarterback who set more individual records at A&M than any other athlete. Hunt was all-SWC three years in a row.
