Recent action by the Texas A&M System Board of Directors made the initial step for air conditioning the Academic Building.

The Board of Directors appropriated \$21,000 from the Available Fund to draw up plans and specifications for air conditioning the Academic Building, part of the suite of offices for the Dean of Veterinary Medicine, part of the Highway Research Center and part of the Dairy Biochemistry Building.

Estimated cost of air conditioning the Academic Building will be \$300,000.

The Board of Directors is expected to act on the plans and specifications at its February meeting.

William Makepeace Thackeray, author of "Esmond," "Vanity Fair" and other noted novels, was also an artist. He illustrated many of his own writings.

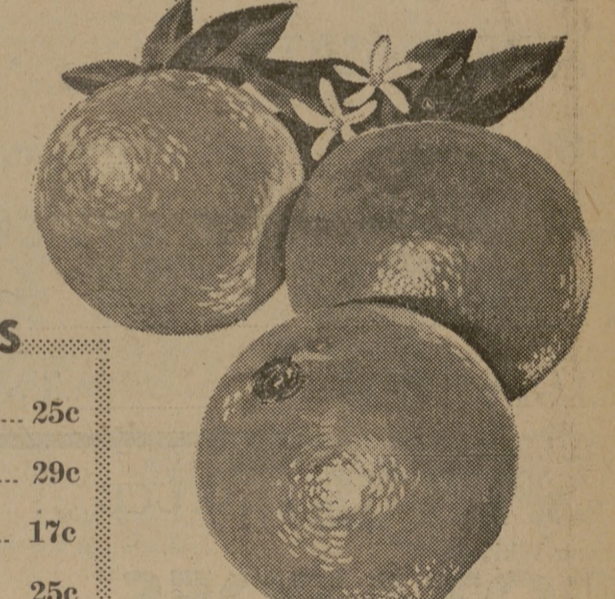

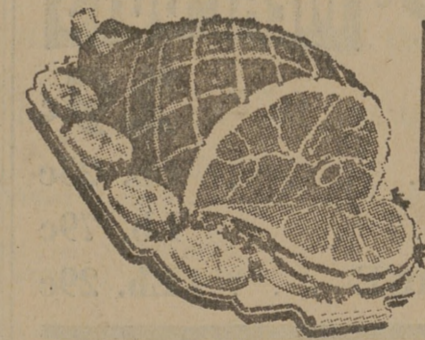

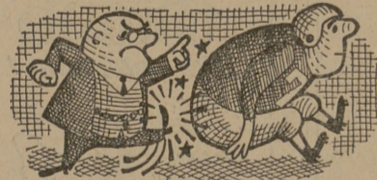
