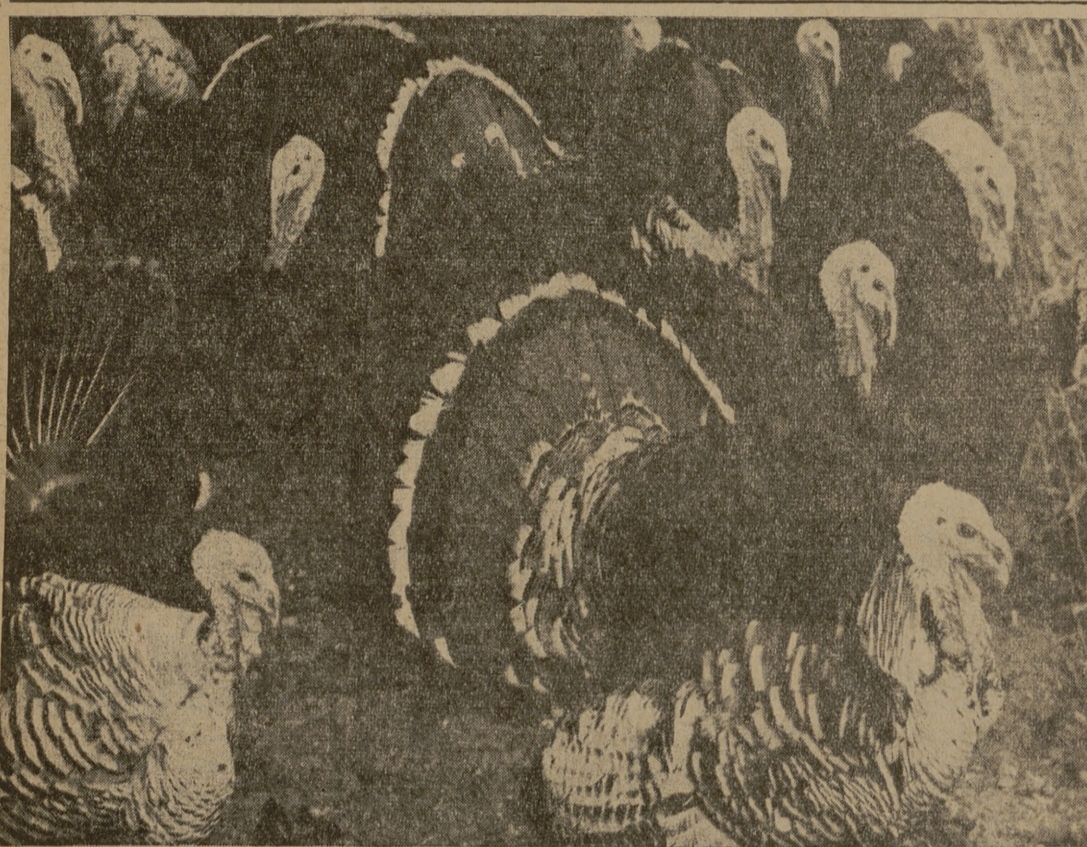


Turkey Shoot Slated Dec. 12



Prizes for Good Shooters

Want to win a turkey or ham? If you've got a keen eye and finger, you might do it at the turkey shoot scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 12, at M. L. (Slick Trigger) Smith's from 10 a.m. until dark.

The shoot is sponsored by the Range and Forestry Club, and the Smith place is located about two miles south of College Station on Highway 6, according to Joe Pogue, chairman of the turkey shoot committee.

There will be events for rifle, shotgun, and pistol, and .22 cal. rifles will be available to people who cannot furnish their own guns. Shotguns and shells will also be furnished at the shoot.

Events for rifles include an open sights contest shooting at a target from a distance of 50 yards. Ten men will shoot at the same target, and the man hitting closest to the bull's eye will win a turkey.

A similar contest for rifles with scopes is planned, at 50 yards, and

an entree has the same chances of winning a bird. At eighty yards, a contestant will shoot at a live turkey's head with open sights, and with a scope he will shoot at it from 125 yards. If the shooter draws blood from the turkey, he wins it.

Another event for rifle and pistol shooters is the ham string shoot, where contestants shoot at a string from which a ham is suspended, at a distance of thirty feet. A \$1 ticket will give an entree four shots at the string, and if he breaks it he wins the ham.

A skeet shoot is scheduled for shotgun shooters, and in order to win a turkey the contestant must hit five skeet out of five. Another special contest for shotgun shooters will also be featured. Shooters will fire at a clean target, and for every ten shooters, the person with the most shot in his target will win a turkey. Any gauge shotgun may be used; however, the Range and Forestry Club will fur-

nish the shells. The turkeys offered as prizes are raised by the Department of Poultry Science, and they weigh between 18 and 21 pounds each.

The Range and Forestry Club is now selling dressed turkeys for \$9 each. These turkeys may be purchased from any club member. Deadline for buying a turkey for Christmas is Dec. 12.

A .22 cal. rifle has been donated by the Sears Roebuck and Co. as an award to the student who sells

the most turkeys and turkey shoot tickets.

Proceeds of the shoot and turkey sales will go to Range and Forestry Club functions which include sending a range plants identification team to Portland, Ore
