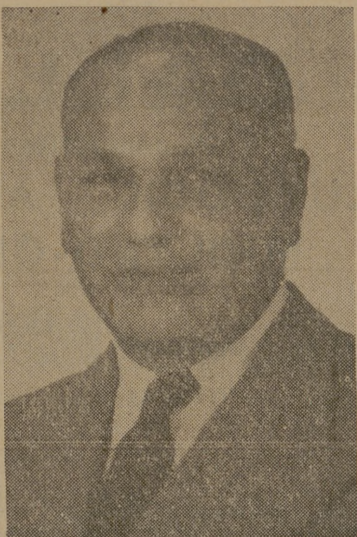
Wednesday at 1:30 p. m. Major General John B. Medaris will speak in the MSC Ballroom on "Facing the Challenges of the Space Age."

Ambassador R. S. S. Gunewardene

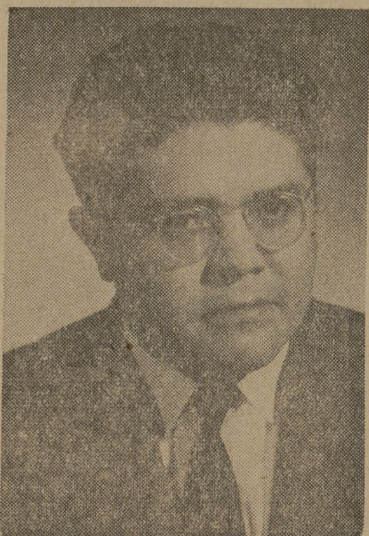
