LOS ANGELES (A)-Jack Cody, coarse, cocky con man who claims he was hired to kill, faced another seige by the cross-examiner in the Finch murder trial today as it became evident the defense

1. That Cody was hired to entrap Barbara Jean Finch romantically, not to murder her.

2. That Dr. R. Bernard Finch was not armed when he went to see his wife the night of her death, and that he killed her by accident or in self defense.

Finch, wealthy 42-year-old surgeon, is on trial with his pretty mistress, Carole Tregoff, 23. They are accused of murder in the July 18 gunshot death of Mrs. Finch, She was slain outside her suburban home.

Cody, brought here to testify from the Minneapolis workhouse insisted again Wednesday under cross-examination that the doctor and Miss Tregoff paid him \$1,400 to do away with Mrs. Finch, and that he had no intention of going through with it. But he was more vague about his purported con-




