In 1951, he came to Texas and began working at Rice Institute. He has taken several trips abroad which include India, Ceylon, and Egypt in 1952; Europe and the Middle East, Turkey and Israel in 1953; Japan in 1956, and Euope, Sabbatical in 1957-58.
