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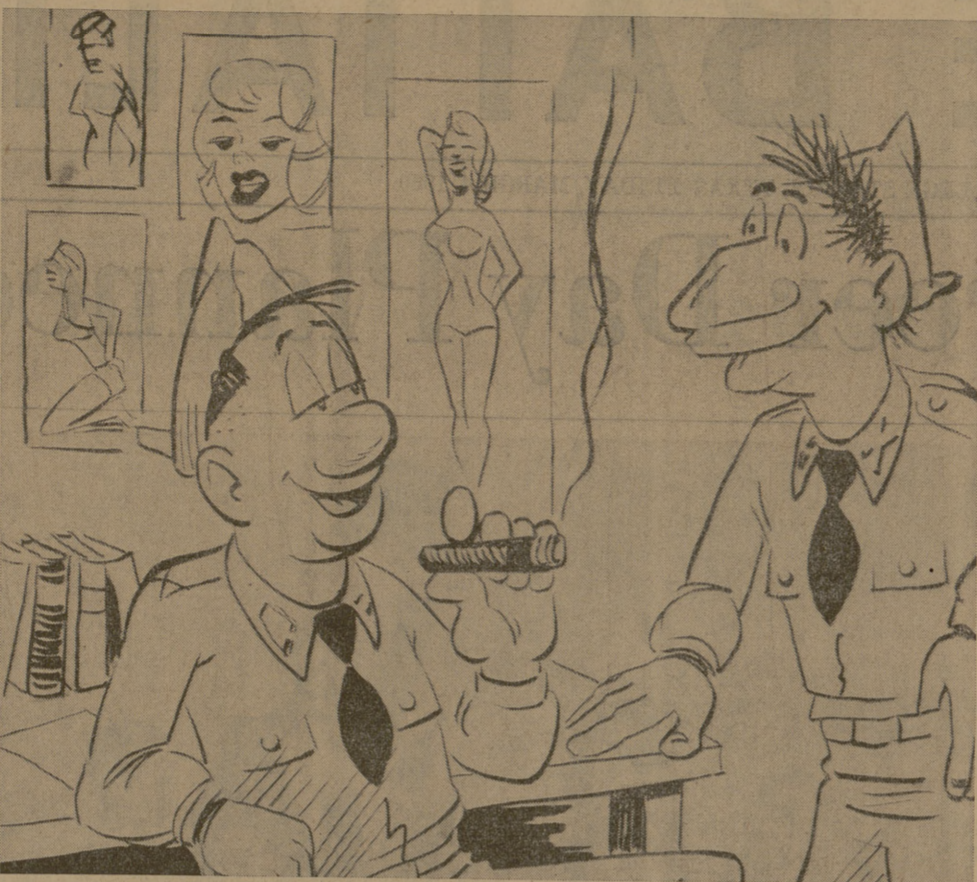
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CADET SLOUCH

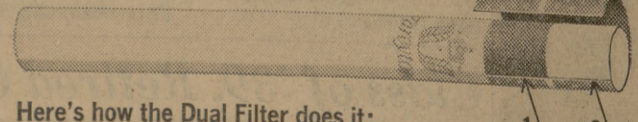
Chiang Kai-shek Due Third Term As Chinese Prexy

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—The way was cleared today for President Chiang Kai-shek to gain a third six-year term without changing Nationalist China's constitution.
The screening committee of the National Assembly voted 555-33 to suspend the constitutional two-term limit on the presidency during the "national crisis," which is as long as the Communists hold the China mainland.
