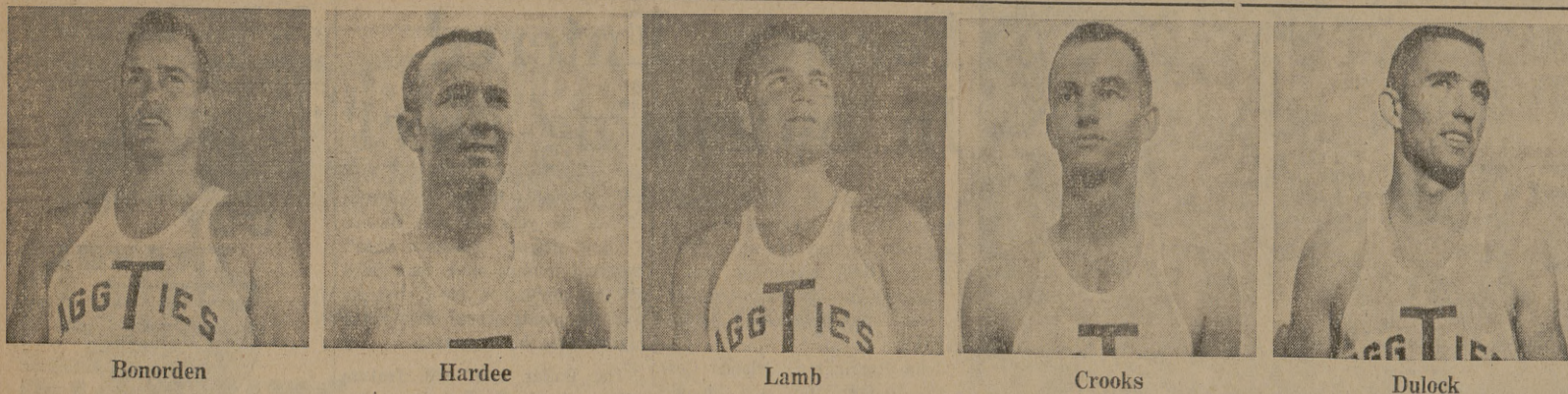

Aggies Host Rice, Baylor in Triangle Track, Field Competition on Kyle Field

A&M, Rice and Baylor compete in a triangular track and field meet on Kyle field here Friday afternoon in what is rapidly shaping up as one of the closest of the season.

The meet was moved up from Saturday because of the inauguration of A&M President Earl Rudder.

Friday's meet gets under way at 2 p.m. (field events) with the first running event at 2:30. Rice and Baylor also will compete in dual freshman division but Aggie Fish will not run because of the Southwest Conference limitation of five fresh meets per year.

Rice, Baylor Surprise

Both Baylor and Rice were surprising on different fronts last week, the Owls upsetting LSU and A&M in a 3-way meet at Houston and Baylor coming in second behind Southern California at Odessa.

The Bears are strong in the sprints, weights, javelin, high jump, mile, sprint relay and high hurdles while Rice is particularly strong in the dashes, both relays, 440 and broad jump.

A&M is expected to win the half-mile and to contest Baylor in the weights and javelin.

On the basis of best marks this spring Baylor should edge out Rice and A&M but if any one performer falters any of the three schools could take the meet. It's that close.

Jones Doubtful

Biggest question mark is the condition of Rice's stellar sophomore, Taylor Jones, ace sprinter who pulled a muscle in the Southwest Conference meet here last May and who ran a surprisingly good 48.6 quarter to win at Houston last week. Should Jones enter the sprints he will get the nod over Baylor's Billy Hollis, who has turned .95 several times this year.

All top three shot putters—Baylor's John Fry and Buddy Tyner and Henry Bonorden of A&M turned in career bests last Saturday.

Tommy tossed the put 54 feet, 9 1/2 inches at Houston last week while Friday and Tyner had marks, respectively, of 53-7 1/2 and 53-2 1/2.

Tyner and A&M's Owen Hill, winner of the SMC discus throw last spring, will challenge in the discus, and A&M's Newton Lamb and Baylor's Gary Wisener should have a torrid battle in the javelin.
