Gay stated that at the sixth annual Freshman Camp, held September 12-15, 1959, 144 entering freshmen attended; the largest assembly in the history of the camp.

"This year, we are planning an even more extensive program of lasting importance and significance to all freshmen who attend the Camp than was offered last year," said Gay.


