The American League is beginning to look most interesting with the surprising Baltimore Orioles leading the pack with an array of youngsters and a shortstop who had no batting average in his first two starts in the majors. The Boston Red Sox have also had their tails up and their stingers out—even after the loss of a top-notch catcher. As expected, the defending champion Chicago White Sox and the Cleveland Indians and the New York Yankees have made their presence known.

Despite the crowded standings, it appears that when the summer begins getting long and hot, the league will become a two—and at most three—team race. The Sox just haven't for the horses and should fade, along with the young, beligerant Birds from Baltimore and the ageing Yanks. Cleveland and the White Sox are the best balanced and the most evident contenders for the title.

The National League is perhaps setting the standard for the entire year as the San Francisco Giants and the Pittsburgh Pirates have moved out in the race. The Pirates have been due for a concentrated shot at the title for the past few years and the Giants are perhaps the best aggregation of talent in baseball. As for the other possibilities in the senior circuit, the Los Angeles Dodgers, the Milwaukee Braves and the Cincinnati Reds are going to have a task catching the Bucs and Giants.

The White Sox highly enhanced their flag chances over the winter with the acquisition of Roy Sievers and other utility men to boost their power. That along with a pitching staff containing such notables as Early Wynn, Bob Shaw, Billy Pierce, reliever Gerry Staley and maybe Herb Score, if he can regain past promise, make the Sox the strongest contenders.

San Francisco hasn't a weak spot on the roster with Willie Mays, Orlando Cepeda, Willie Kirkland, Willie McCovey, Tim Lincecum, Ed Bressoud and others forming a formidable crew. And the pitching may be even better with Johnny Antonelli, Jack Sanford, Billy O'Dell, Sad Sam Jones, Billy Loes and Mike McCormick comprising perhaps the best staff in baseball.

The Giants will be even tougher to handle this year after their narrow miss at the title last year. And the Giants are also aspiring to win, since the Big Men make a habit of a World Series appearance quite frequently. The Giants won in 1951 and in 1954.

It looks like a good summer—for the Giants and the White Sox.
