Dr. Joseph L. Matthews, a former employe of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, on August 1 will become director of the Division of Extension Research and Training of the Federal Extension Service.

He was serving as administrative assistant on the Texas staff when he resigned in February, 1951, to become a member of the Federal Extension staff.

Matthews is a native of Uvalde County and holds both B.S. and M.S. degrees from A&M in animal husbandry and agricultural economics, respectively.

He received his Ph.D. degree from the University of Chicago in adult education and educational measurement.
