Texas To Send Four Athletes To Olympics

By The Associated Press. Texas will do better in the 1960 Olympics than it did in 1956—it has six athletes in the big show compared to five before.

Three made it in track and field. They were Dave Clark, the North Texas State pole vaulter; Earl Young of Abilene Christian College, the 400-meter dash man, and Stone Johnson of Dallas, in the 200 meters.

Texas will have a man in, of all things, boxing. He is Humberto Barrey of Robstown, who is the flyweight on the United States team.

Jay Arnette of the University of Texas is on the basketball team. Rafer Johnson, a Texan who went to UCLA, is in the decathlon.

In 1956 Texas had Bobby Morrow of Abilene Christian College and Eddie Southern of Texas in track and field. Gih Ford of Amarillo and Bill Evans of Houston in basketball and Rafer Johnson in the decathlon.

The men making it in track and field all were a pleasant surprise. Morrow and Southern had been considered the best prospects but both failed and unheralded Clark, Young and Johnson got in. Clark was the miracle man — he never had vaulted close to 15 feet until the trials recently when he soared to 15 feet 3 inches. He was the first Texan ever to go over the 15-foot mark.

Dr. B. W. Wilson will present a paper at the Seventh Congress on Coastal Engineering at the Hague. He also plans to visit Grenoble, France, laboratories (hydraulic) University of Grenoble.
