

CS Swimmers Place in Meet

The College Station Swimming Team Senior Girls copped first place in their division at the Gulf-Crest Country Club swimming meet last Friday and Saturday in Houston.

The four members of the senior girls division racked up 47 points for their trophy. Forty members of the College Station Swimming Team competed in the meet.

The relay team of Eleanor Worley, Becky Kahn, Pam Hayes and Rosemary Thompson swam to a first place finish in the free-style relay and placed third in the medley relay. Miss Kahn placed second in the 100-meter back stroke and the 200-meter free-style. Miss Hayes placed second in the 200-meter breast stroke and third in the 100-meter fly. Miss Worley placed fourth in both the

100-meter back stroke and the 100-meter free-style.

The senior boys relay team—Joe Brusse, Earl Caris, Leslie Brusse and Scott Manning—took two fourth places. Brusse placed third in the 200 meter free-style and fifth in the 100-meter fly race.

Kathy Myers, Linda Gruber, Kay Fisher and Martha Lawrence—the junior girls relay team—

placed second in the 113 1/2-meter free-style relay. Virginia Patterson and Karen Thompson replaced Miss Lawrence and Miss Gruber in the medley relay race and the team copped a fourth place.

In its final stages the center's reactor will be capable of operating at five megawatt power.

The first unit of the equipment for the center, which should be in operation by February, is to be capable of handling a wide range of research projects, with power limited to 100 kilowatts.

The facilities will be used not only for teaching and research here, but will also be available for work for all parts of the A&M College System, for other colleges and universities throughout the Southwest and for basic research sponsored by industry.

Experimental facilities will be located about the reactor pool on the basement and first floors. On the basement floor, the two big power reactor operating positions (the tank end and the controlled irradiation cell end) will be surrounded by various ports providing high level radiation fluxes for experiments outside the shield.
