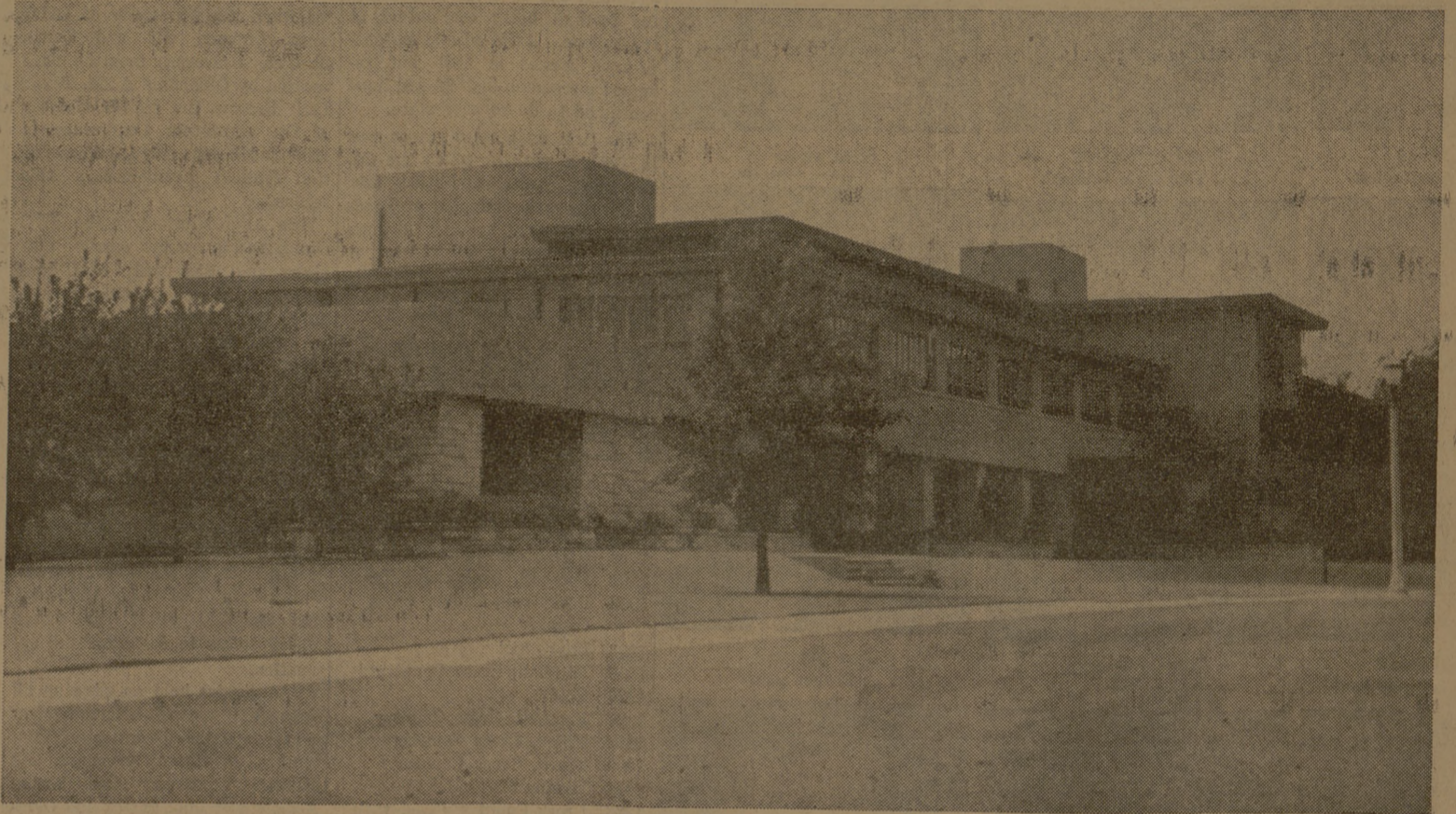

GREAT ISSUES . . .

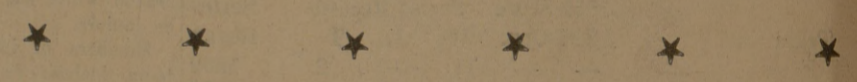

functions as a student service committee, arranging for a lost-and-found auction, sponsoring receptions and many other civic services. Gives its members an excellent opportunity to meet people.

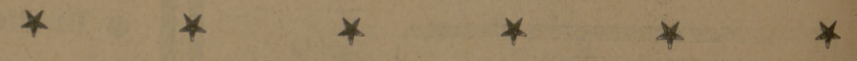
TALENT . . .
